THE C. N. R. DEAL

The scene in the House of Commons at Ottawa which marked the adoption of the closure to force the Canadian Northern bill through would have delighted the heart of the most truculent. It is described by a press correspondent as follows:

"Wild scenes of angry disorder which threatened at one time to terminate in a riot, swept Parliament tonight. Amid shouts of 'Call in the police!' and a tumult and angry roar above which no words could be heard, Sir Thomas White and Hon. Rodolphe Lemieux were both on their feet, quivering with passion, and gesticulating at one another and at Deputy Speaker Rainville. A moment later, Hon. William Pugsley, backed by Opposition cheering and Government hooting, was out in the middle of the floor, facing the manifestly nervous Deputy Speaker, and demanding recognition from the Chair for Mr. L. J. Gauthier (St. Hyacinthe), who was endeavoring to address the House.

Passion ran riot in the Chamber, and both sides roared personalities and insults at one another. The din at times was deafening, and nothing beyond the babel of shouts could be heard in the Press Gallery. Bitterness and trouble had been brewing all night, but the storm broke shortly before midnight, when, under the closure rule, Sir Thomas White endeavored to take the floor from Mr. Gauthier, and was recognized by the Chairman.

Sir Thomas White gesticulated angrily, but could not be heard. "Shame," "Coward," "Serve your masters, the big interests," "Call in Lash to tell him what to say," were among the shouts heard from the Opposition side. "Give the plain people a chance once in a while, Mr. Millionaire Financier," was Mr. Ethier's taunt, amid mingled cheers and groans.

It would seem as if the British Parliament in its most stormy days had nothing on Ottawa. However, the fight went in favor of the interests, whose watered securities are to be purchased for real dry money by the people of Canada.

Even the Montreal Journal of Commerce, which has always been strictly impartial when discussing political matters, considers this bill "extraordinary."

The Journal says: "The extraordinary part of the situation is that the Government are proposing to assume all the company's obligations of the past, provide all this money for the present and future purposes of the enterprise, and pay Messrs. Mackenzie & Mann, through the convenient process of an arbitration, an unknown number of millions for the privilege of doing so."

"In all their bargains Messrs. Mackenzie & Mann have been able to plead that the money which they sought to raise was for the construction of their various lines of railway. Here is a new bargain in which they are to raise a huge sum—not in the money markets of the world, but from the people's treasury, not for the railways, but for themselves personally! And all the present indications point to their success."

"Gather ye rosebuds while ye may" seems to be the idea of Sir Thomas White. He has a shrewd suspicion that he may not be Minister of Finance very much longer, and that unless this bill was rammed through Parliament this session, it would have mighty little chance to pass during the next.

NOTES AND COMMENTS

Following in the footsteps of Napoleon, about a hundred and forty years ago or thereby, General Korniloff, who has evidently been pondering the doings of the "Little Corporal" in his heart, has indicated his desire to be military and civil dictator in Russia. Conditions in both countries would seem to be similar, although with the difference of time. The people of Russia will be but little better for the revolution if they are only to under go another autocracy for the one they have thrown off.

Kerensky has been prompt in trying to suppress this Tartar aspirant to power. He ordered Korniloff at once to hand in his resignation and sent a successor
