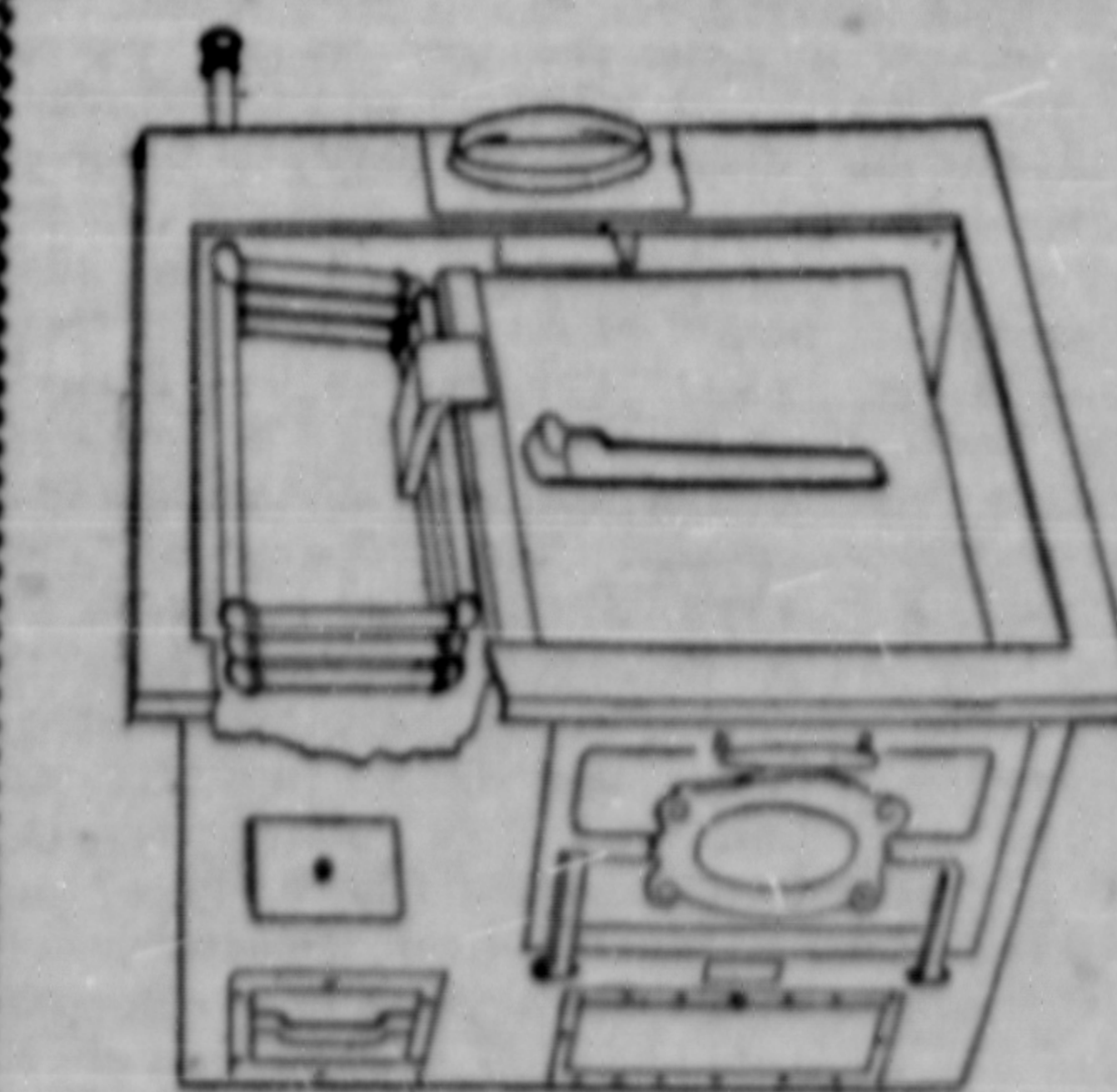

### LAND SETTLEMENT BOARD MAKES GOOD PROGRESS

Victoria, Sept. 12.—Reports reaching Mr. Maxwell Smith, the chairman of the Land Settlement Board, from the other directors recently appointed under the Land Settlement and Development Act indicate that in each section of the province satisfactory progress is being made, the members of the board doing their best to clear up all the appraisal work prior to the setting in of the more unfavorable weather. Some of the work now being undertaken should really have been completed many months ago.

It is stated by the chairman that a limited amount of money is available now for loaning purposes, and at the rate new applications are being received Mr. Smith anticipates that the loaning feature of the board's work will continue to be of the first importance.

A number of important development schemes are also engaging the attention of the board. It is understood that as soon as the money market shows signs of easing up a little, active attention will be devoted to these schemes.

Several locations have possibilities of high productivity have been singled out, but before practical development can be commenced in accordance with the prescribed terms of the act passed during the last session, adequate reports dealing with every phase of the undertaking will be required. It is the intention of the board to be fully satisfied upon the fertility and adaptability of the land so selected and the certainty of adequate returns before a single cent will be sanctioned for development work. No scheme will be undertaken unless the highest possible production may be confidently looked for. First and foremost the aim of the board is to administer the Land Settlement and Development Act in a practical and profitable manner.
