THE DISILLUSIONMENT OF THE GOVERNMENT

Ottawa, Sept. 12.—The title which should be applied to the page of history dealing with the last week in parliament would be "The Great Disillusionment," the government which a fortnight ago stood for the win-the-war government, whose arms were outstretched to embrace all serious men conscripted to the winning of the war now stands revealed as the win-the-election government with arms outstretched to grasp off the votes it can, and to repel all who are suspected of designs to vote against it.

This afternoon the prime minister brought into the House of Commons two members of the British House of Lords, and five minutes after they had taken their seats to the right of the speaker, he showed them how the Canadian government dealt with an opposition.

Sir Robert, who has been reputed indisposed for the past few days, over-rode the order paper, and called the orders of the day without delay. Then Sir George Foster moved the closure, on the second reading of the disfranchisement bill.

Mr. Speaker called for the feeling of the house and the thunder of "Yes," from the government side was met with the answering thunder of "Nay" from the opposition.

Several minutes after the distinguished members of the House of Lords had taken their seats, there was a division and ten minutes later the premier had demonstrated the gentle art of squelching an opposition by a majority of 25.

Unearthed Ancient Speech.
After listening to the speech of John Sinclair, of Guysboro, however, who was unkind enough to unearth an ancient speech of the prime minister of the disfranchising of the "Outlanders," which led to the South African war, Sir Robert thought that his guests had had enough, and escorted them without the chamber. Had they remained to listen, they would have heard a round dozen members from the opposition side, who within the past month or so broke with their party and voted with the government for conscription, and many of whom since that time have worked with

the government for a national administration, stand on their feet and in emphatic and vehement language condemn the government for the present bill, it was a notable fact that until a late hour tonight almost every man who spoke was a conscriptionist.

GERMAN AIR RAIDERS SPECIALLY EQUIPPED

Paris, Sept. 14.—The Gotha airplanes, with which the Germans have been bombarding England, are biplanes fitted with two motors, developing 450 horsepower, and with two tractor propellers, according to Georges Prade, the French aviation expert. They carry three persons, the pilot, a bomb-thrower and a machine gun operator. All can serve the quick-firers if they are attacked, as there are three of these guns carried.

M. Prade, who has been watching the machines at the front, says that these machines if passing at an altitude of 13,000 feet, for instance, on the attack can return at an altitude of 20,000 feet without their bombs, their super-compressed motors giving them full power at great heights.
