GERMAN RAIDER IN THE ATLANTIC

Baltimore, Sept. 15.—Word of the sinking of the British steamer Grampian Range by a German raider a few weeks ago in the Atlantic was brought to port today by the captain of a vessel who talked with a member of the crew of the freighter after he had reached England.

The Grampian Range was trailed by the raider for thirty-six hours before the German commander thought the time opportune to sink her. During the time the raider followed the freighter those on board were congratulating themselves on having come through "the barred zone," not suspecting that the vessel wearing a similar coat of war grey was other than an Allied merchantman. At the end of the thirty-six hours those on the British freighter were dumbfounded when the vessel ran up a signal, which read, "Stop or I will open fire."

At the same moment several false ports and deck superstructures were swung back, showing a formidable array of heavy guns. The lifeboats of the Grampian Range were soon in the water, and while the crew were being taken prisoners some of the Germans placed bombs aboard the freighter.

After they had been on the raider several days the men from the Grampian Range learned the reason the raider did not sink her upon sight was because they were also after another vessel in the vicinity and did not want to arouse the suspicion of her captain by gunfire.

The Grampian Range was one of the newer vessels of the Furness, Withy Line.
