PALESTINE'S GOVERNOR RECALLED BY TURKS

London, Sept. 20.—News has reached London that the Turkish Government has withdrawn Djemal Pasha, the most hated official in Asia Minor, from his post of Governor of Palestine owing to the intense feeling which his methods aroused among the population under his control.

The growing hostility of the civilian population recently proved a heavy military handicap, owing to the undercurrent of sympathy with the Sherif of Hejaz, whose increasing prestige among the Arab element throughout Asia Minor is causing the Turks most serious concern.
