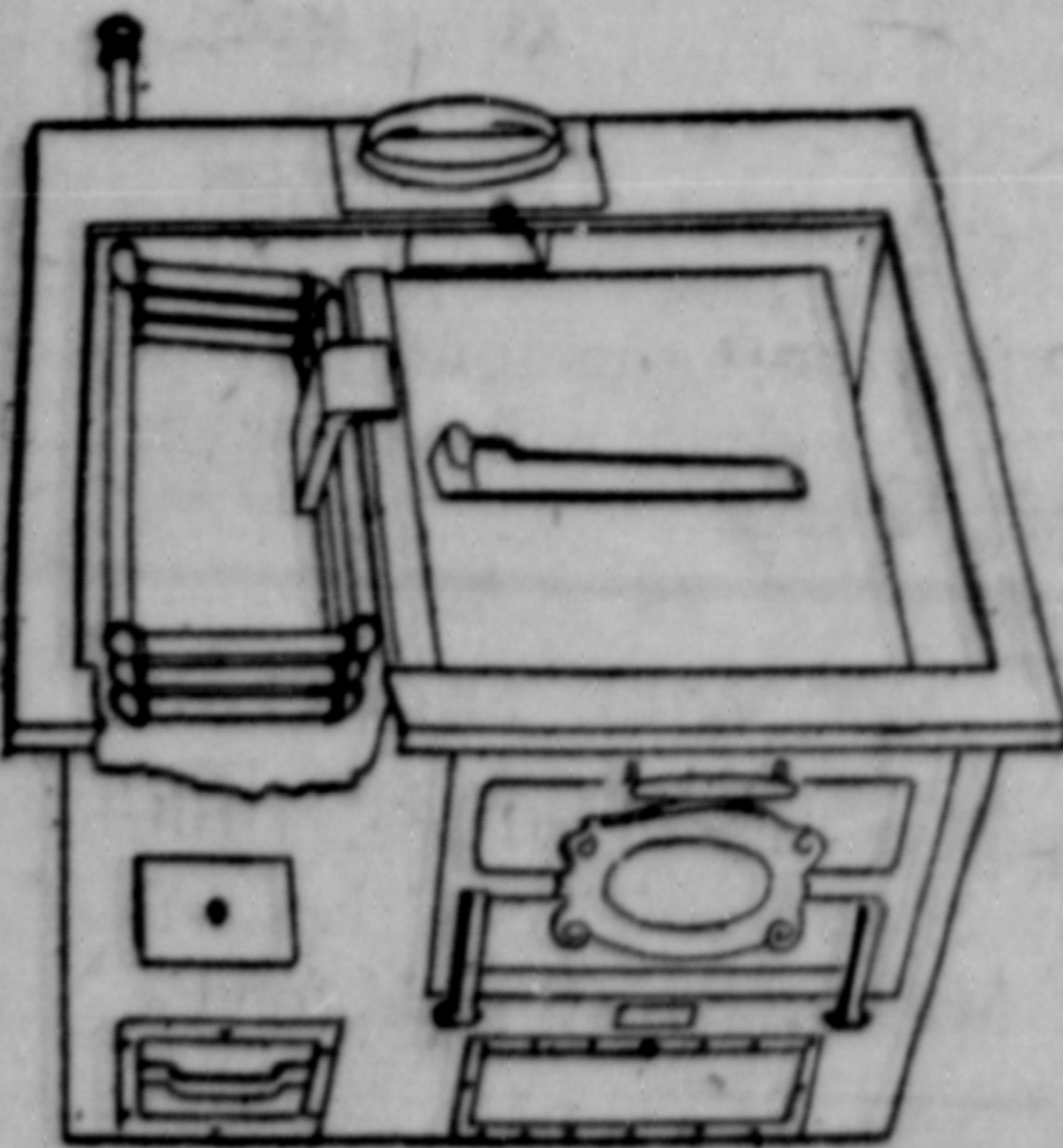

nable positions all along the line. They had sworn not to leave a prisoner in our hands. We took 40,000 up to May 1, and the number of prisoners had increased to 63,000 by the end of June.

The writer in the "Revue" then goes on to give instances of the bad moral of the army, and proceeds to prove by events and by calculations that the second battle of the Aisne cost the Germans more dearly than those of Verdun and the Somme. He concludes as follows:—

Such is the position of the German army. They have lost their line with an immense amount of material and more than 400,000 men. Their army is shaken, and is being reinforced by elements drawn from other services. Their 1918 class has been tapped, and their power of initiative has vanished hopelessly, together with the positions that should have secured it and the new reserves that should have been used for the purpose of keeping it.—Ex.

PERU SENDS GERMANY AN ULTIMATUM

(Special to The Daily News.)
Lima, Sept. 27.—The Peruvian Government has sent, or is going to send, an eight-day ultimatum to Germany. Peru has been unable to obtain any satisfactory replies to her protests regarding the sinking of the Peruvian barque Lornon, hence her present action.

SASKATCHEWAN FLOATS BIG PRODUCTION LOAN

Regina, Sask., Sept. 26.—The Saskatchewan Government announced the flotation of a loan to be offered to the people of Saskatchewan. It is known as the Saskatchewan Greater Production Loan.

The object of this loan is to raise money within the province to provide the necessary funds for the carrying out of the scheme of rural credits under the farm loans act, the purpose being to supply money at cost to farmers requiring it for the development of their farms and the bringing about of increased agriculture and live stock production in Saskatchewan.

The farm loans act came into operation a few months ago, but already applications for loans from farmers for productive purposes have reached a total of more than \$2,500,000.

Ten-year Saskatchewan Greater Production Loan bonds will be issued in denominations of \$20, \$100, \$500 and \$1,000, bearing interest at five per cent. per annum, payable half-yearly. A unique feature of these bonds is that they will be redeemable at par any time upon the giving of three months' notice to the Provincial treasurer.

This is the first loan of its kind ever floated in Canada.
