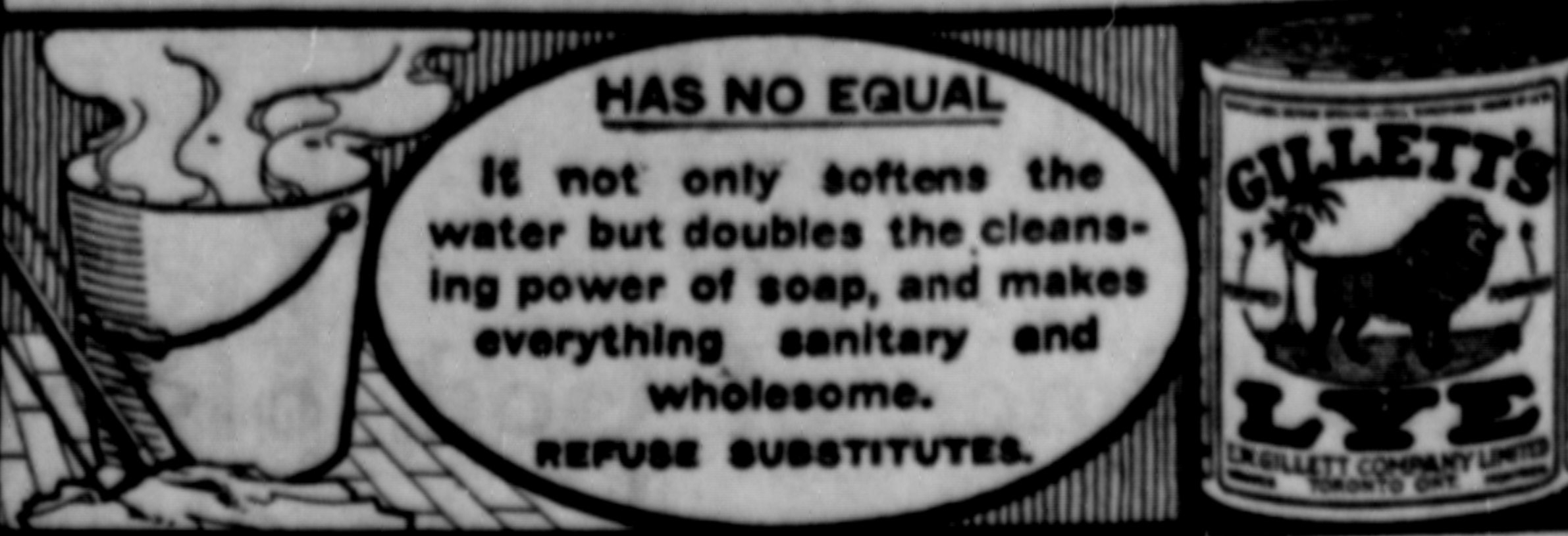

Mrs. W. E. Draney, of Haysport, is visiting Prince Rupert.

Mr. F. D. Hunter, of Butedale, was in the city yesterday.

Mrs. R. B. McGinnis, of Alice Arm, accompanied by her little son, have arrived in the city.

It is hoped that not a man, woman or child in Prince Rupert will fail of their duty on October 20th.

Mr. A. Methot, late of the staff of the Royal Hotel, has returned from a visit to Seattle. He leaves tomorrow on his way to his old home in Montreal, where he has not been for twenty years.

The case of Wong How, the Chinaman brought in from Queen Charlotte City, was brought before Judge Young yesterday at the court house. The accused elected for a speedy trial, and the date was fixed for the 29th inst.

**MINING NOTES FROM OMINICA DISTRICT**

The Rocher de Boule mine is shipping ore daily.  
At the Golden Wonder George McBean is making great headway with the shaft contract. A lot of very fine ore is being taken out. There is a big pile of ore sacked ready for shipment.

Alex. Chisholm has staked a group of claims near the Tom Forest property. He has a ten foot showing that is uncovered for twenty feet. It assays 44 ozs. of silver and 88 in gold.

On the Wilson Bros. property nine men are working two shifts and making good progress. Mr. Haines went up this week. He expressed the belief that they have a sure-enough mine in this property.

The Chisholm boys have taken a lease and option on a property on Grouse mountain and have begun work. They figure on shipping a car or two of ore very soon for test purposes. They will haul six miles to Barrett station.

Paddy Higgins came in from the Babines this week after a good season's work on his claims. He has a good deal of ore ready for shipment and is working the property with the idea of opening up the ore for a big sale rather than to make small shipments.

The road work on the Santa Maria road has been finished for this year although about six miles at the far end were left undone. One gang came down Sunday and after fixing up a snow road on the hill the other gang came into town. The work was well and economically done.

W. S. Sargent made a trip last week into the Babines to examine the silver-lead property that has occupied the attention of C. G. Harvey for several years. Bill says that Harvey has a very good looking prospect. He has considerable high grade ore sacked and can get out enough more to make a substantial shipment this winter. The property is worthy development on a larger scale.

D. B. Morkill came up on the train Wednesday night from the New Hazelton Gold & Cobalt property on Rocher de Boule mountain. He reports the mine in excellent shape and producing very rich ore. A winz is being sunk one one of the shoots of molybdenite and some beautiful ore is being secured. Arsenical iron in the same shoot carries very high gold values. Mr. Morkill brought some excellent specimens up with him.—Omineca Herald.

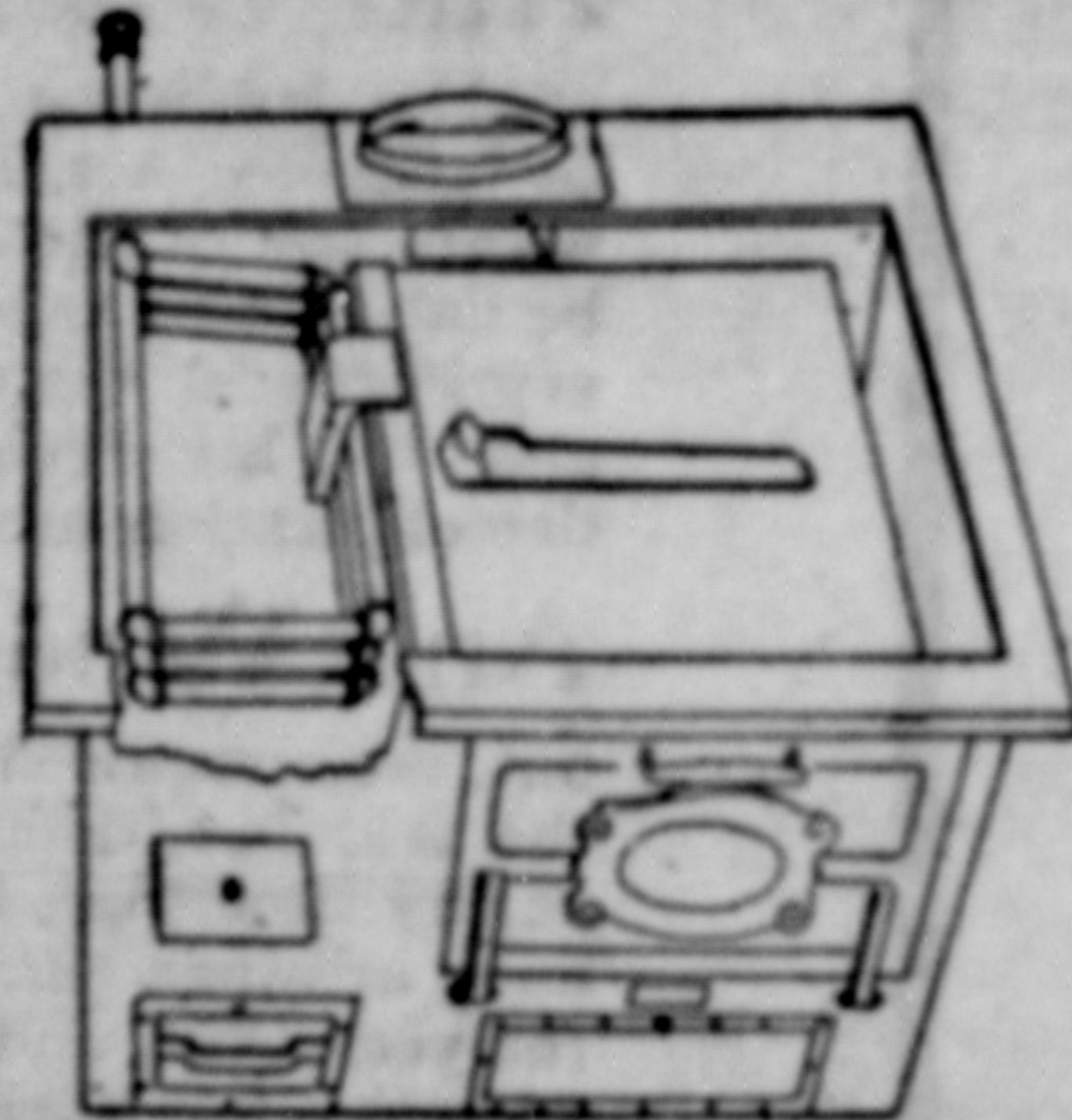
