The G. T. P. steamer Prince Rupert only arrived today after one o'clock. She had been delayed on account of the large quantity of freight moving at present on the coast.

The case of Wong How, the Chinaman who was accused of stealing money from the trunk of another Chinaman at Alford Bay, was brought before Judge Young this morning in the County court.

Information reached town yesterday of the loss of one of the crew of the Lillooet. When at Porcher Island he went ashore, and on coming back, he failed to reach the vessel. The worst fears are entertained of his having been drowned.

The diver was expected to go down at Shawatlans passage today to locate the ends of the broken water main. The sleeve casting which was made specially to join the break is in readiness and it is hoped to have the broken pipe fixed up soon.

The Rev. Fathers Hartman, Beck, and Walge arrived from Vancouver on today's steamer. They had been south for the consecration of Bishop Bunoz. Bishop Bunoz was at first expected to arrive back today in Prince Rupert, but he will not now arrive until Saturday.

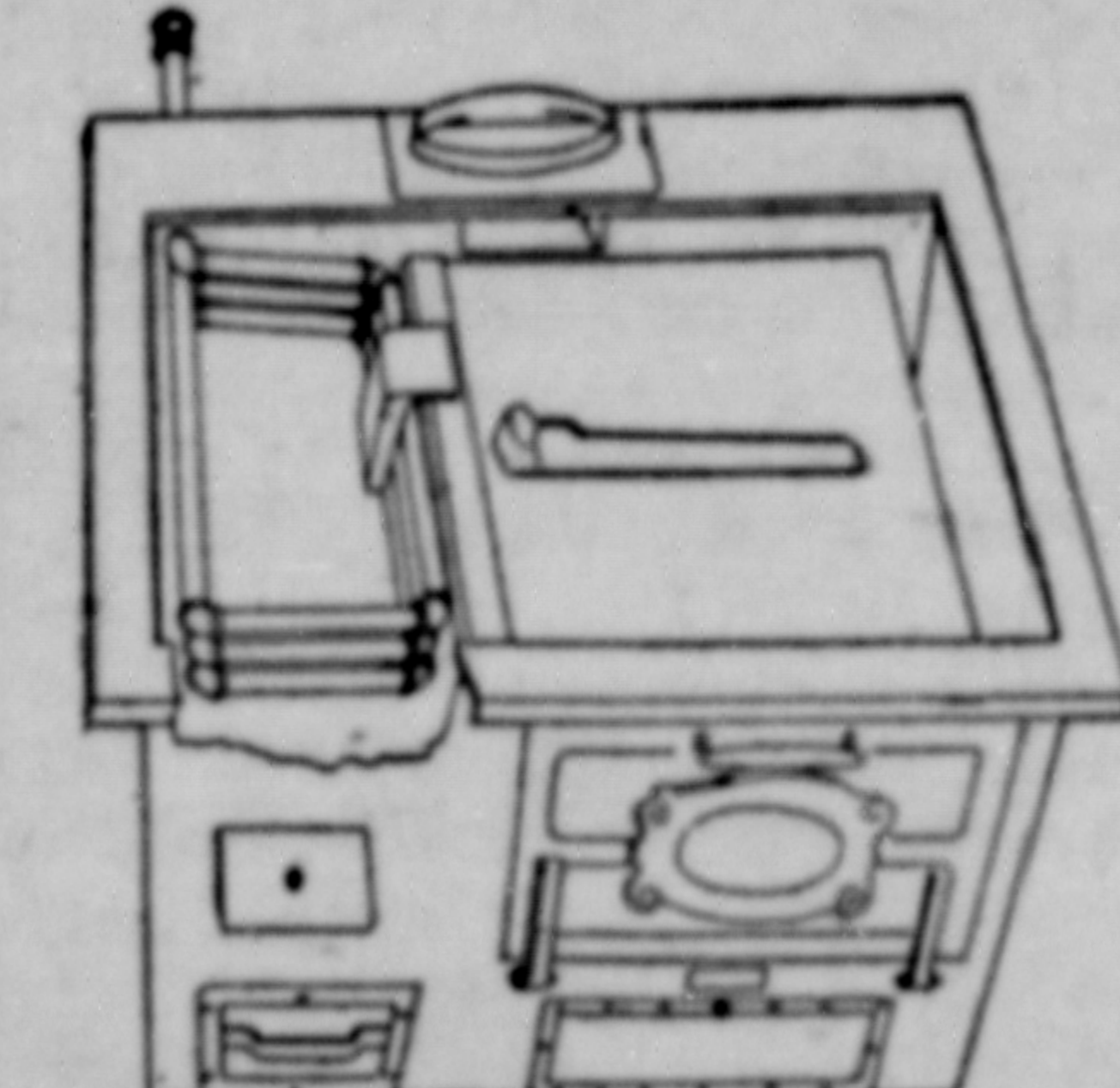
