JAP STEAMER WATCHES DESTROYER SINK U-BOAT

A Pacific Port, Oct. 24.—Officers of a Japanese steamer that arrived here today from a European port said they saw a British destroyer sink a German submarine in the Atlantic August 16th. The submarine had just made an attack on another Japanese freighter, which arrived here last week with the story of its escape.

The mate of the vessel arriving today said the two vessels were near together when the U-boat opened fire. His ship put on full speed and got out of the way, while the other stood the brunt of the attack. When the other vessel escaped the submarine turned to attack the remaining Japanese, which made ready to use its stern gun. Just then, according to the mate's story, there was a sheet of water thrown up from the British destroyer as a shell struck the submarine. A cloud of smoke followed. The submarine, the mate said, apparently had failed to observe the approach of the destroyer and was unable to submerge in time to escape its shells.

The G. T. P. despatched a special train to the east today consisting of fifteen cars loaded with blister copper from Anxox. This was brought into Prince Rupert by the Steamer Amur. The train load consisted of about 530 tons of copper valued at about \$300,000.

THE PROFITEER AGAINST PEOPLE

Toronto, Oct. 25.—Mr. Hartley Dewar, K. C., member of the Legislature for Southwest Toronto, addressed a meeting of Ward One Liberals in Armstrong's Hall, Pape avenue, last evening. He explained the new franchise act, and pointed out its inequalities. He said the Liberal party was a party that trusted all the people, and the Liberal party was responsible for the enfranchisement of women in Ontario.

The issue in the forthcoming Dominion election, he said, was the profiteer against the people. The Liberals did not propose to have their fighting-ground chosen by any Union Government. Conscription was now the law of the land, and must be and would be accepted by everybody. The supreme question today was whether they were going to stand for a Government which allowed the profiteer.

ORDER FOR TORPEDO BOATS RECEIVED BY BETH. STEEL

New York, Oct. 24.—Bethlehem Steel Corporation has received orders from the Government for over 150 torpedo boats, to cost \$1,500,000 each. This would make the total value of the order approximately \$225,000,000, and no doubt is the largest contract, from the amount of money involved, awarded by the Government since war was declared. A profit of 10 per cent. would mean \$22,500,000 for Bethlehem Steel, but it is believed the contract will net the corporation a profit closer to 7 1/2 per cent. Bethlehem Steel has on its books orders amounting to \$500,000,000. This total is from \$150,000,000 to \$200,000,000 in excess of the high record reached before the United States entered the war.

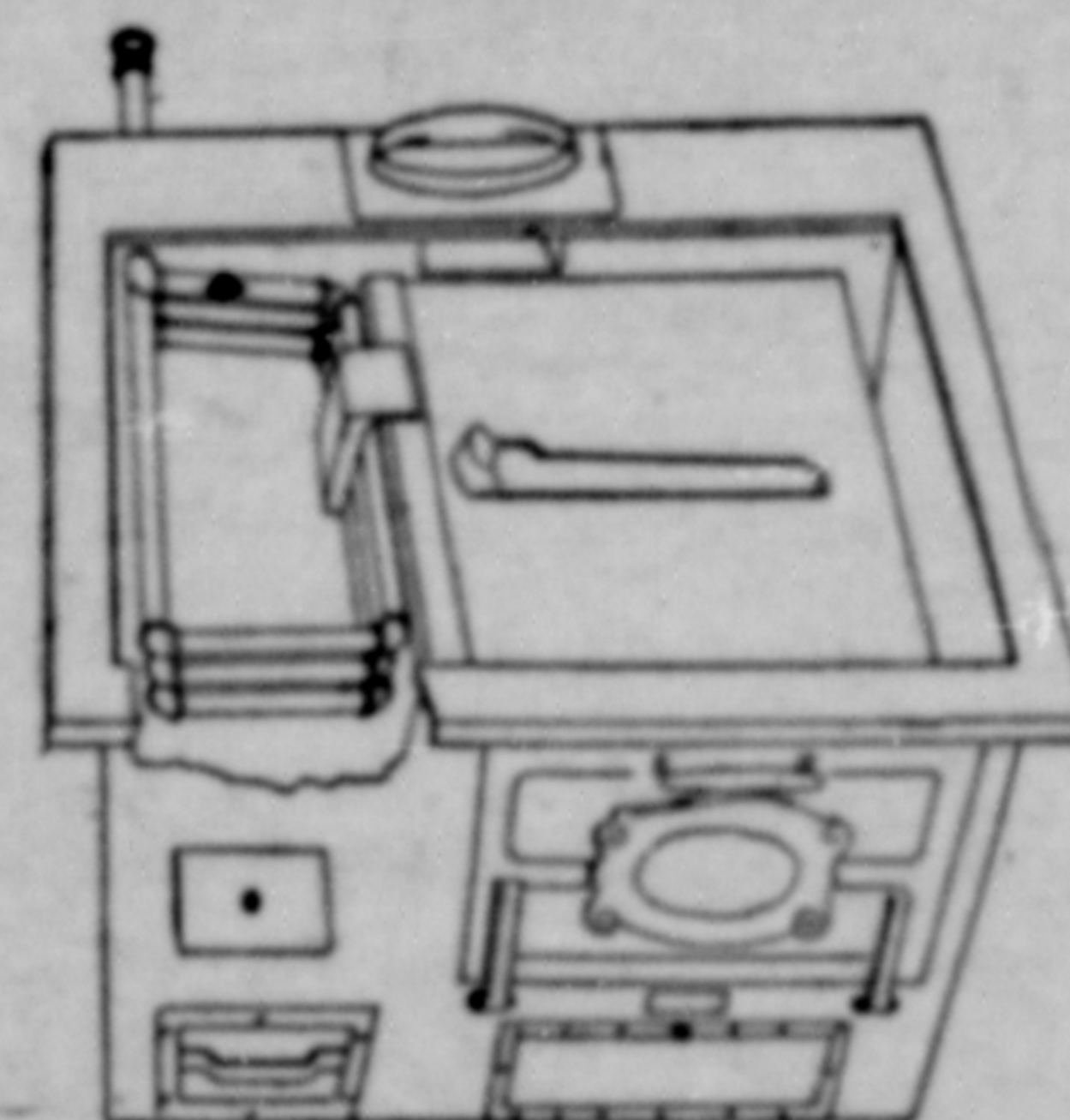
