ORDER FOR TORPEDO BOATS RECEIVED BY BETH. STEEL

New York, Oct. 24 .- Bethlehem Steel Corporation has received orders from the Government for over 150 torpedo boats, to cost \$1,500,000 each. This would make the total value of the order approximately \$225,000,000, and 'no doubt is the largest contract, from the amount of money involved. awarded by the Government since war was declared. A profit of 10 per cent. would mean \$\$22,500,000 for Bethlehem Steel, but it is believed the contract will net the corporation a profit closer to T5 per cent. Bethlehem Steel has on its books orders amounting to \$500,000,000. 


