**NEW YORK SCHOOL
CHILDREN IN RIOTS**

New York, Oct. 25.—Rioting by school children in protest against the Gary system of instruction in some of the city schools became so serious this afternoon that reserves were summoned from three police stations and fifty branch detective bureaus.

Ten boys and one man were arrested during the forenoon, in which the children, armed with stones and clubs and bottles, battled with the police and smashed windows at a number of schools in Harlem and the Bronx. The man arrested, the police say, denounced the Gary system and urged the boys on to further disturbances.

This is the third day of demonstrations against the Gary system which, approved by Mayor Mitchel, is opposed in the local political campaign by John F. Hyland, the Democratic candidate for Mayor.

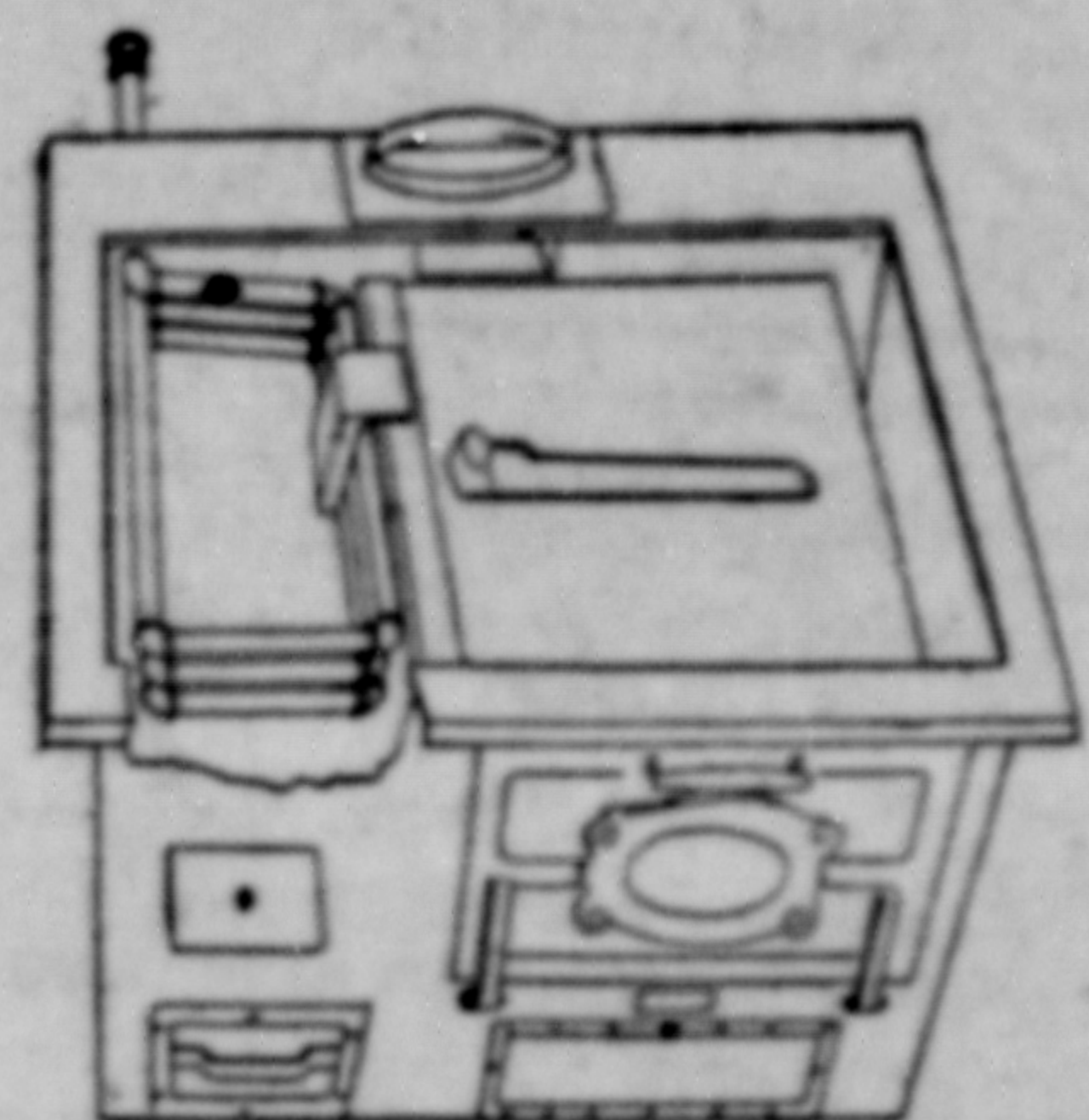
