Tenders for Coal.

Tenders were then opened for
the supply of 50 tons of coal for
the use of the city. The Prince
Rupert Coal Company tendered at
the rate of \$9.50 per ton for
Ladysmith lump, the city to take
delivery at such times as is con-
venient and the cost of weighing
to be borne by the city. Albert &
McCaffery, Ltd., tendered at the
price of \$9.49 per ton f.o.b. wharf.
The matter was remitted to the
Board of Works Committee and
the superintendent of utilities
with power to act.

The pending litigation which
the city is involved in was giving
Ald. Montgomery some anxiety.
He was enquiring regarding the
law procedure. The reports from
the heads of the departments re-
garding the sale of city material
or tools, requested two or three
weeks ago, not having material-
ized, caused an enquiry from Ald.
McRae, but the city clerk had
none. Thereupon Ald. Cesey drew
the attention of the council to the
state of 11th Avenue as the result
of the storm. It is all littered
with timber blown down. Upon
this being taken cognizance of,
the council adjourned.

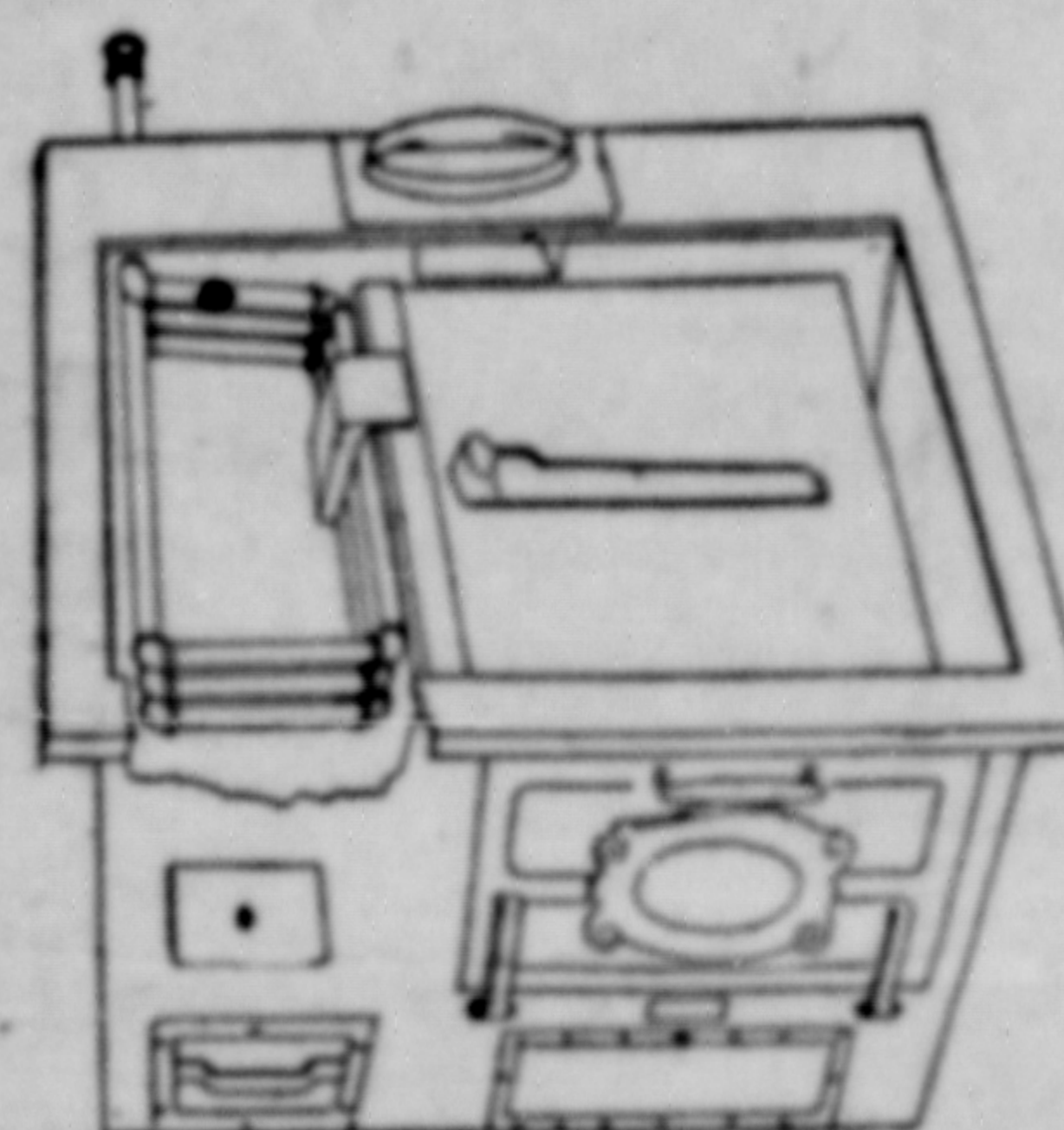
