 first step up and is now chief
 skipper and has his first com-
 mand. He is on patrol duty.

 east. She will visit Winnipeg and
 thereafter proceed to New York
 on a buying visit, where she will
 purchase a large and assorted

**LINCOLN MADE SERVICE
 COMPULSORY IN 1863**

It is a matter of record in
 United States history that Presi-
 dent Lincoln, after attempting to
 prosecute the Civil War with vol-
 unteer troops, at last, in 1863,
 turned to conscription in order to
 secure the necessary forces.

Since Lincoln is regarded as
 one of the greatest statesmen this
 continent has produced, it is in-
 structive at the present stage of
 Canadian history, to see how he
 dealt with the problems that
 arose.

The President was warned that
 grave disorders might follow the
 enforcement of the conscription
 law, which it was argued, was in
 opposition to the constitutional
 privileges and liberties of the
 citizen.

Lincoln took the ground that
 democracy means an equal share
 in the burdens, as well as in the
 blessings of a republic and de-
 cided on the firm enforcement of
 the law. All opposition was firm-
 ly repressed.

On entering the present war,
 the United States profited by past
 experience and promptly adopted
 compulsory service.
 Now that Canada has adopted a
 similar course she is in a better
 position to do her full share and
 though opposition is unlooked for
 repressive measures are provided
 in the Act.

**SAYS JAPAN CAN NOT
 SEND MEN TO EUROPE**

A Pacific Port of the United
 States, Nov. 3.—Baron Tanetaro
 Megata, head of the Japanese
 Financial Commission that ar-
 rived here yesterday, said last
 night that it was impossible for
 Japan to send an army to aid the
 Allies on the European battle-
 front.

"If in the face of physical im-
 possibility Japan should be fool-
 hardy enough to make a super-
 human effort to send troops, and
 if she speedily became exhausted"
 he said, "who would then protect
 the Orient if Germany remained
 victorious?"

He said that the great distance
 and the bad condition of the
 Trans-Siberian Railroad stood in
 the way of sending troops to
 Russia, for once there they could
 not be supplied. Japan, however,
 he said, had helped Russia by
 allowing her to send the Siberian
 troops to the front. Japan had
 kept her pledge to Russia in this
 respect, guaranteeing that the
 absence of troops would in no-
 wise imperil Russian interests.

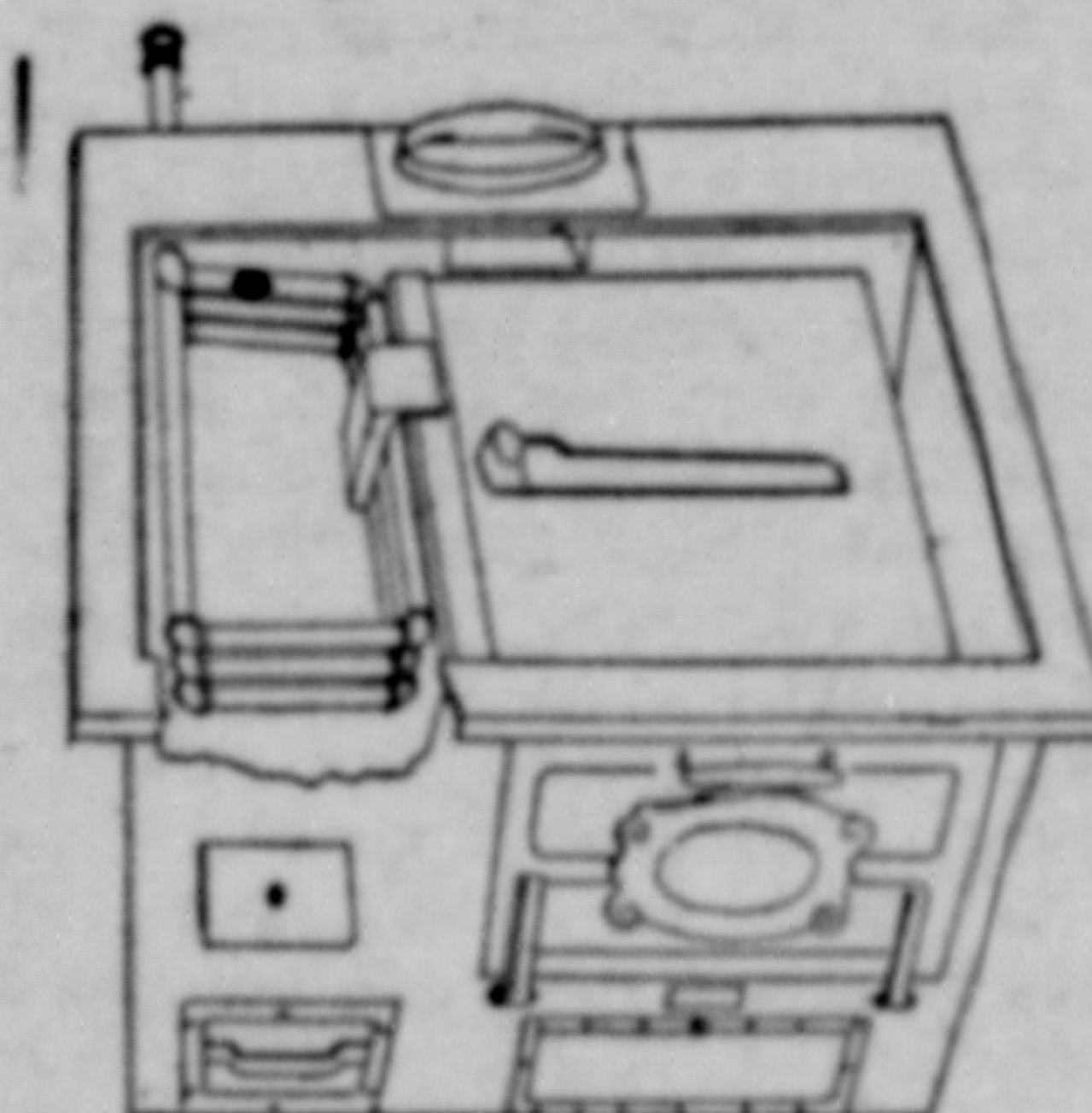

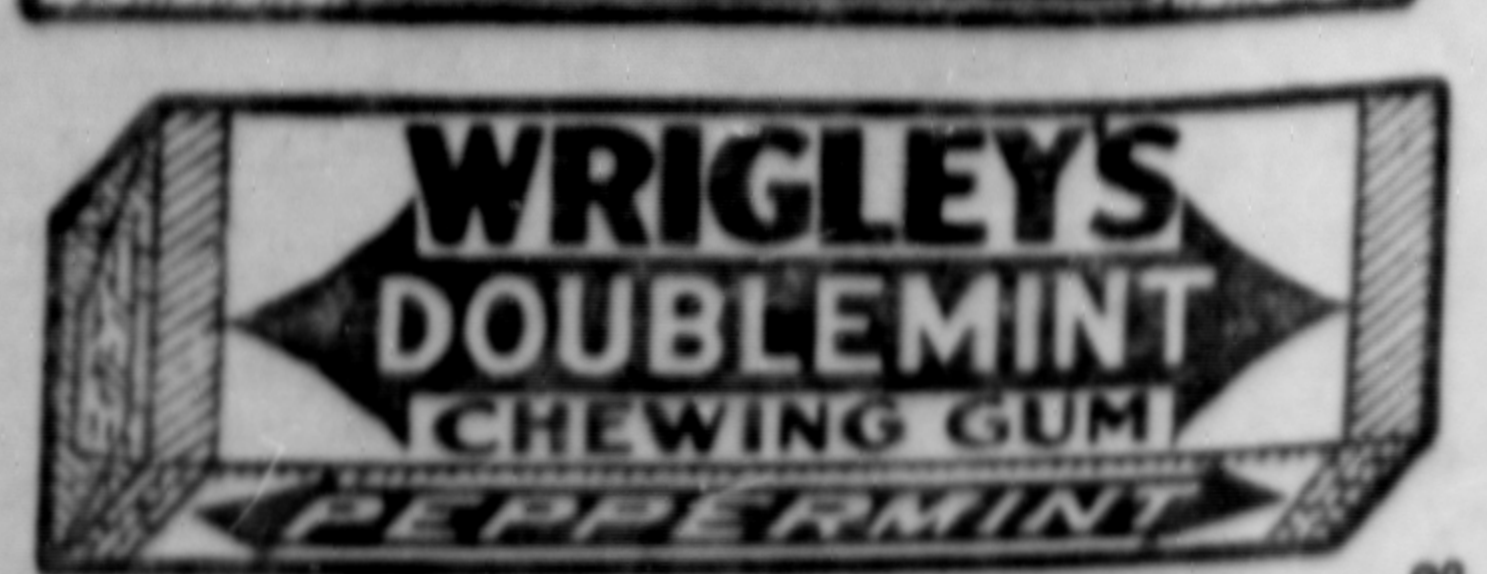
