**SINN FEINERS START
FOOD CONTROL BOARD**

London, Nov. 5.—The Sinn Fein
organization, according to The
London Morning Post, has start-
ed a food control department in
Ireland independent of the Gov-
ernment. The newspaper prints
the text of a circular, which it
says is being distributed widely,
asking priests to help in making
an inventory of the food stocks
as an initial step toward "retain-
ing in Ireland sufficient food for
the entire population and ar-
ranging to have it available for
distribution whenever famine is
to be dreaded." The circular de-
scribes the danger of shortage to
the excessive exportation of Irish
food products, the consumption
by the large garrisons there and
the submarine menace. It de-
clares a wish to prevent a repeti-
tion of the calamity of 1887.

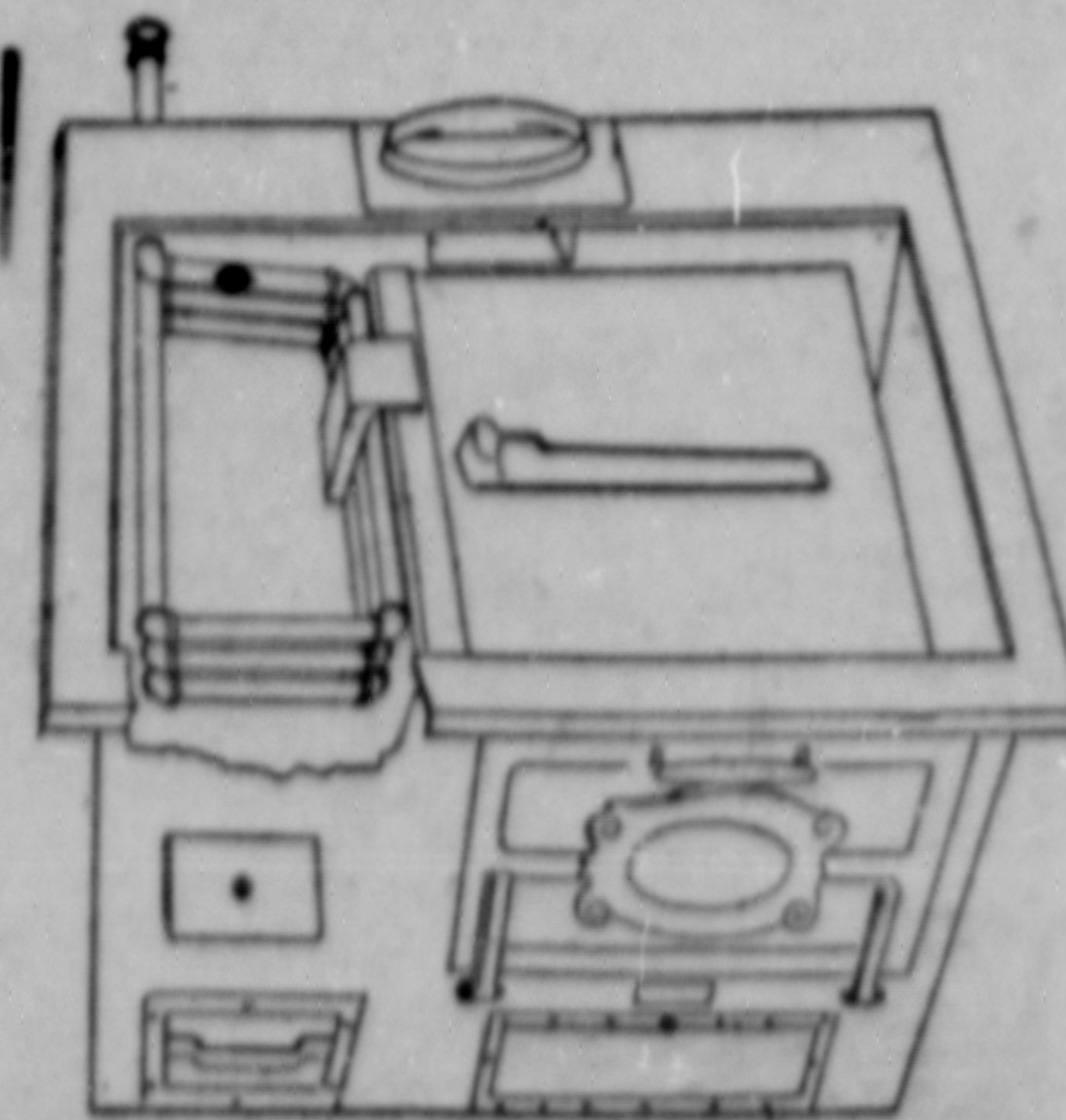
