**ALL A TRICK!**

Sutton, Que., Nov. 6.—"Sir Robert Laird Borden and his colleagues have resorted to quite a trick in calling themselves the win-the-war party," said the Hon. Sydney Fisher, addressing a political meeting here last night.

"Once there were two parties in Canada, the Reformers and the Tories. The old Tory party became so discredited before the people that it decided to take the name of Conservative. Later the Conservative party became so discredited that it had, in turn, to change its name to that of Liberal-Conservative.

"Now we have the adoption of a name which reflects the opinion and will of all the country."

Mr. Fisher said everybody wanted to win the war. He warned his hearers against a Borden government conspiracy to rob the electorate of their votes. Back of the conspiracy, he claimed, were the war profiteers.

**THAT FURLOUGH FOR  
THE FIRST CONTINGENT**

Ottawa, Nov. 6.—The department of militia today announces the following:

"Much misunderstanding has arisen from, and it is feared that disappointment will be caused by, the suggestion that all the original members of the first division now serving in France be given a furlough. Nothing is known in the militia department of any such intention on the part of the military authorities in France, and it is believed that the exigencies of the military situation forbid the adoption of such a course. It is to be noted that it is stated in press despatches that the Australian government, after considering the matter, has abandoned the proposal to grant furloughs to the original members of the first Australian expeditionary force now serving."

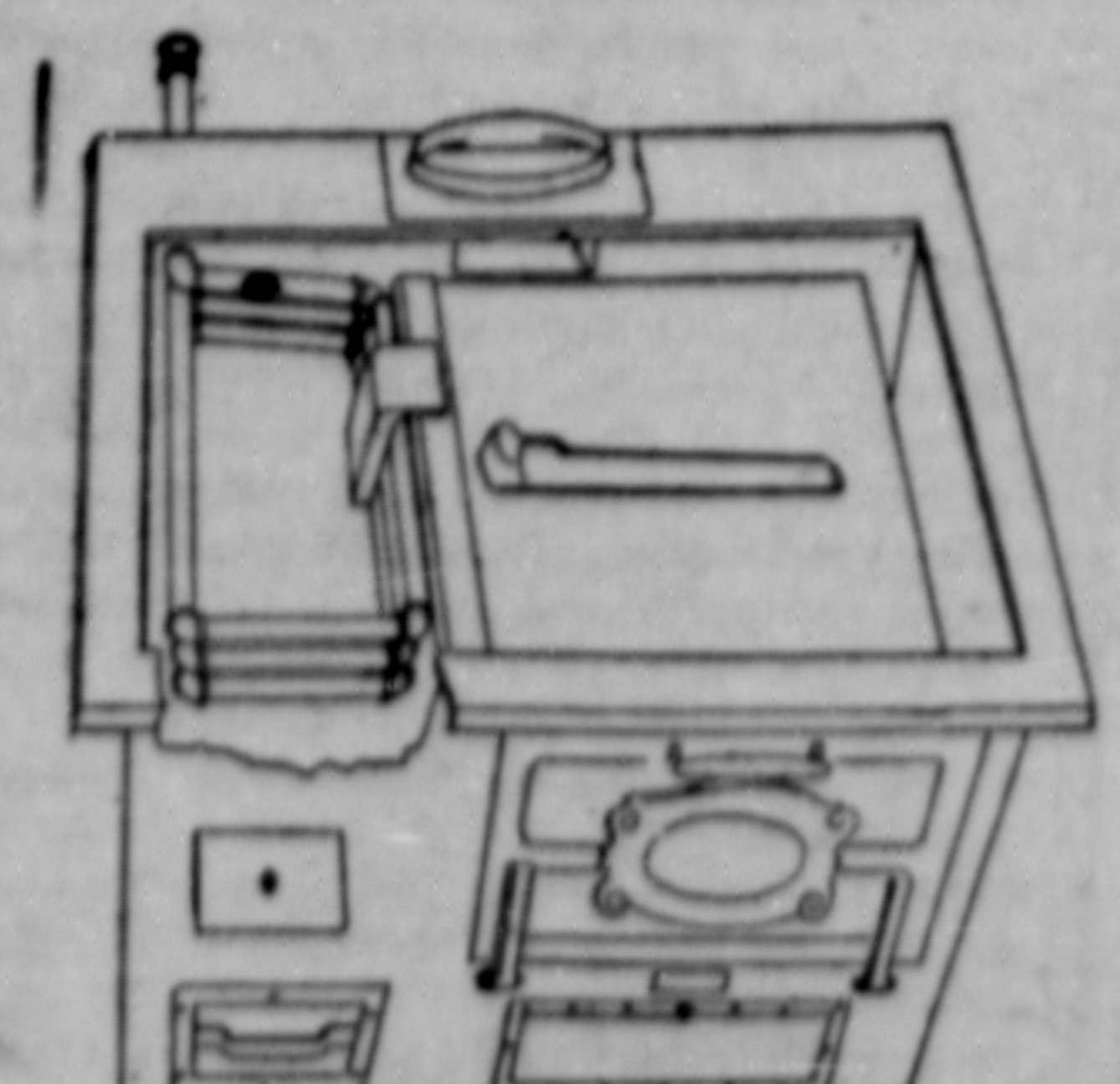
