**GERMANS OFFENDED
AT SWEDISH MINISTER**

Amsterdam, Nov. 10.—Hjalmar Branting, Swedish Minister of Finance and Socialist leader, is quoted by a newspaper correspondent as saying:

"Peace will come through the triumph of democracy. Germany's regime cannot be reconciled with the spirit of our times, Belgium will be completely reinstated and will receive reparation. Alsace-Lorraine must be restored to France."

The Cologne Gazette's semi-official Berlin correspondent, commenting on this utterance, says: "We expect the Swedish Government to explain whether Branting's words can be reconciled with true neutrality."

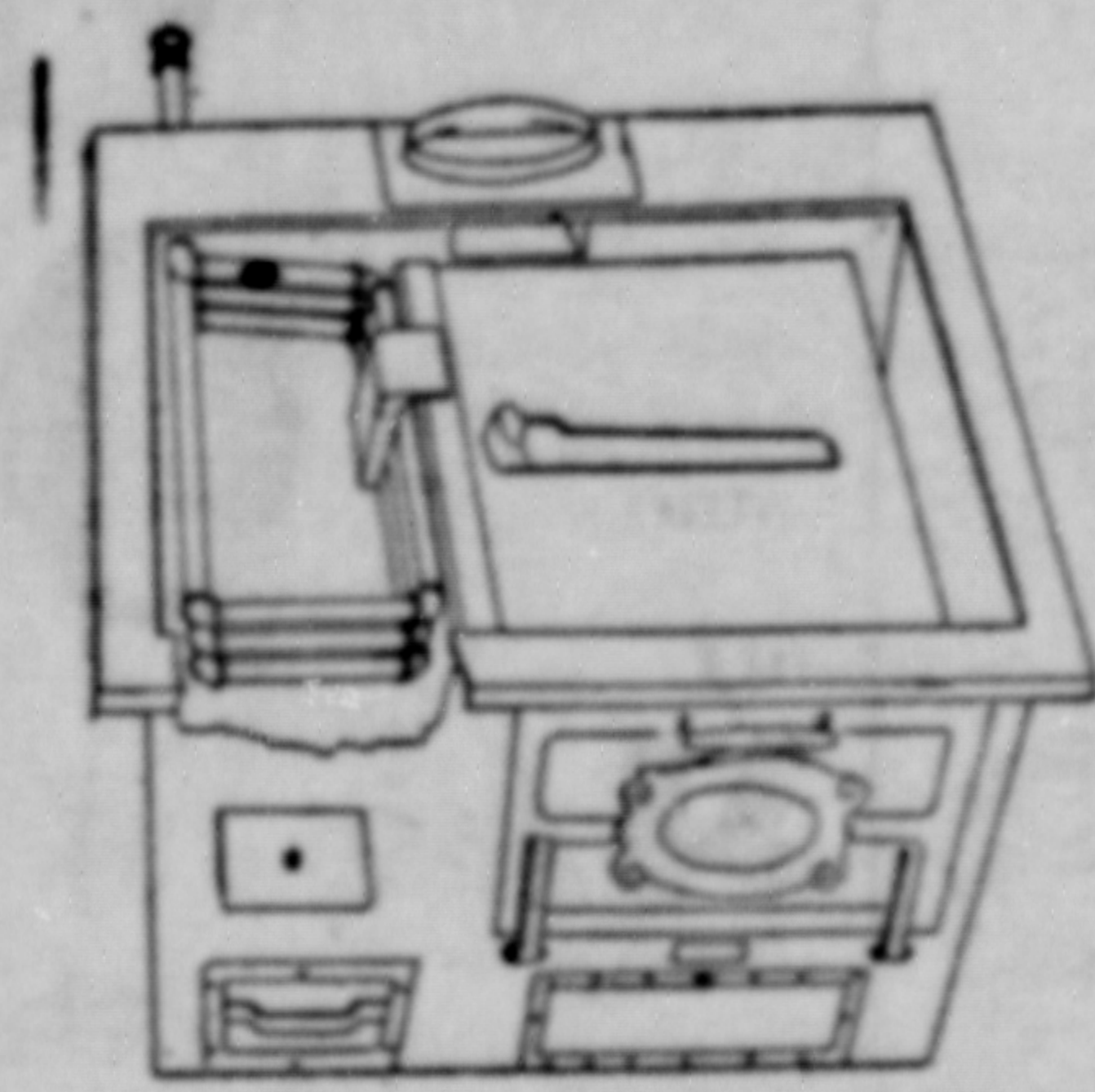
