LIBERALISM

The difference between Liberalism and Conservatism has been defined by the late W. E. Gladstone in two pregnant sentences. They are so much to the point that we quote them again. "The principle of Liberalism is trust in the people, qualified by prudence. The principle of Conservatism is mistrust in the people, qualified by fear." These few words aptly sum up the attitude of the two parties, which are in the majority in Canada at the present moment. There are other parties, too, but their day is yet to come, and that day is not very far distant either.

Mistrust is one of the things in this world that generates further mistrust. The Conservative party mistrusts the people. And on the other hand, that mistrust has begotten of the people a mistrust of the Conservative party.

The people of Canada at first trusted that the late Government would do what is right, by the whole of the people. Instead of which they do that which is wrong. They have looked on while a small coterie of their financial friends in the east have been looting the people and the public treasury. They have looked on and laughed while prices of the necessities of life have steadily mounted higher and higher. When the clamor became too great, they appointed a Food Controller, who issued recipes for economic dishes. Who did everything but control, so far as is evidenced by the prices of commodities at present.

When the Government suddenly and without warning changed its policy, after the people of Canada had had assurance after assurance that conscription would never be brought into force in Canada, it declined to go to the people with its new policy. It declined to put the matter up to the people even by a referendum. It definitely refused to consider the people at all. It mistrusted the people. The Borden Government was fearful that the

people of Canada would not do its duty in the war.

If Canada is a democratic country, as it is alleged to be, then the people have a right to have a say in the matters of policy which the Government chooses to bring up. Canada elected the Borden Government with a majority six years ago, partly upon the very fear of conscription, which was a red herring skillfully brought across the trail, to disguise the unsavory aroma of their real intentions.

But the late Borden Government says that the people of Canada have no right to be consulted upon any such right about turn in the policy of the Government. They mistrust the people. And now they expect the people to trust them again under the new name of Unionists.

The common people of Canada who have to work hard, and do work hard to make a living. Sir Robert Borden and his satellites, or rather let us put it the other way, his satellites and Sir Robert Borden have proved that they are not friendly to the people. They look upon the masses chiefly as likely subjects for fleecing. They have declined to take any steps to restrain the rapacity of the food Barons, and the other manufacturing reivers. They have considered that every cent that the working people have ought to be paid back to them in the shape of enhanced prices for everything. They have allowed these robbers to put their ideas into practice too, without a single restraint. Indeed, they took off the war profits tax and made a vague promise about next year.

A continuance of this state of things is to be expected with Sir Robert Borden and Sir Thomas White as Finance Minister in control of the new alleged Union Government. The ordinary voter knows only too well what to expect from these gentlemen. The majority voted for them once, but now? Never again!
