GERMANS' EFFORTS TO CROSS PIAVE RIVER FRUSTRATED. HUN ATTACKS ON PASCHENDAELE FAIL-TURKS IN PALESTINE RETIRE FIVE MILES MORE-ENEMY HIT HARD ON ALL FRONTS

Piave river to the Adriatic Sea, the Italian troops are maintaining their line and holding the invaders from gaining any further portions of Italian territory. Gen. Diaz, the commander of the Italian troops, withdrew his advanced posts in certain sectors. Extremeby strong attacks are being made by the combined Hungarian, Austrian and German forces. They are making a desperate effort to break through the line of the Italian resistance before the reinforcements of French and British troops which are on the way, can arrive. According to the provisions of PHONE 55 the War Times Elections Act passed by the late Government, all women who have relatives in the army may be permitted to vote at the coming election. Any woman who has a father, husband, brother or son serving with the forces, either with the Canadian troops or in any British regiment, or in the navy, is entitled to a vote.

All they have to do is to call at the enumerator's office in the Smith Block and have their names put on the list. This new list of voters will be posted up conspicuously on the 2ad of Decem- 2 ber and all intending voters should see to it that their names are placed thereon before that date.
