THE FULLEST MEASURE

"To find the men, the money and the resources necessary to ensure the fullest measure of support to our heroic soldiers at the front, and to enable Canada to continue to the very end to do her part to win the war," in the words of Sir Wilfrid Laurier, is the first duty of the Liberal Government.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier has indicated in no uncertain manner that there are many abuses existing at the present time which require rectification, and that he will rectify them.

It is in the interests of the people of Canada that for every dollar spent in the purchase of war supplies that the Government gets one hundred cents' value.

This is of course rank heresy to the big interests, who are able to get Sir Robert Borden and his Finance Minister to run things in Canada in their interests.

Support for the soldiers overseas is necessary and protection for the people at home against exploitation is none the less so.

A Union Government with Sir Robert Borden as premier, and Sir Thomas White as Minister of Finance would be little more inclined or capable of holding down the exploitation which has been going on in the years past.

ment—the War Time Election Act, better known as the Disfranchise Act. This ingenious piece of legislation enfranchises some five hundred thousand women and leaves about one million, five hundred thousand good Canadian women out.

The long-suffering women of Canada know what it is to pay two prices for everything they put into their children's mouths, and by that fact they know the Borden Government. They are wise to the sinners.

Another weak spot in the War Time Elections Act is the clause which disfranchises some fifty thousand aliens, including many British subjects of fifteen years standing, simply because they are of foreign-enemy birth.

When the Borden Government, on sober second thought, reviews the fact that the fifty thousand disfranchised aliens are only a fraction of a multitude of German Canadians whom the act does not reach, and that the influence and sympathy of that multitude will go with their insulted compatriots it is inclined to go out and kick itself round the block for having made such a mess of it.

The only consolation in all these sportsmanlike attempts to disable the other fellow is the Military Voters' Act. The Borden

Government is perfectly satisfied with this. It looks like a straight steal on a wholesale scale. They will do the counting and distribute the votes as needed.

LAND REGISTRY ACT

(Sections 35 and 134.)

Re Application No. 9609-L, Filing 1871. TAKE NOTICE that application has been made to register Anne Duffy, of Prince Rupert, B.
