THE REAL ISSUES

The unanimity with which the Conservative party all over Canada has taken up the cry of Union Government at this late date is one of the curious things to be considered at this election. The Tories are all good Unionists—this time.

With Sir Robert Borden and his profiteers returned to power under the new name of a Union Government, the people of the Dominion will probably be mulcted still further.

FLIES FROM BRITAIN TO MEDITERRANEAN

London, Nov. 26.—The Admiralty announces that a successful air attack in the vicinity of Constantinople has been successfully accomplished by a large British bombing airplane, which flew from England to a British base in the Mediterranean in a series of eight flights.

The stopping places included Lyons and Rome, and the total distance covered was nearly 2,000 miles. The machine was actually in the air thirty-one hours. This is believed to be the world's record for a cross-country journey and for the weight carried.
