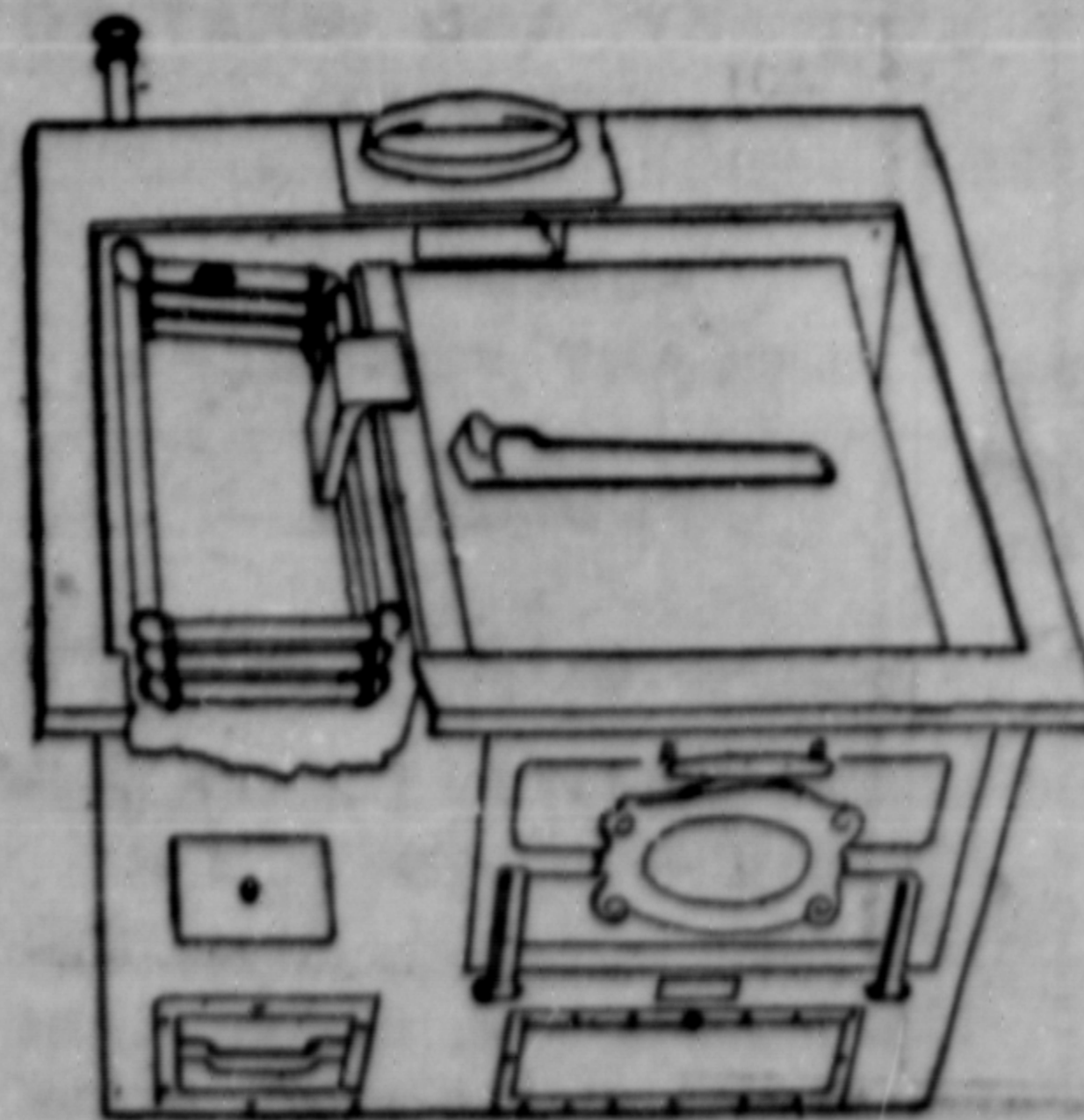

STOCK RAISING ON THE QUEEN CHARLOTTE

Fred. H. Turner, a well known former insurance broker of this city and New Westminster some years ago, left on last night's boat for the north where, with several associates, he is going into stock raising on a large scale. Mr. Turner and his associates have acquired a large tract of grazing land on an island in the Queen Charlotte group and have made arrangements to stock it extensively with cattle and some horses. They expect it will be four or five years before they secure any extensive return but are prepared to wait that long. As an experiment and in order to secure quick results in another line, they are considering going into goat raising on a considerable scale for a couple of years. They expect that the goats will kill off considerable of the sal-lal bushes and improve the grazing land for the cattle, and give results in mutton and milk in the meantime. The Island on which they are locating is particularly favorably situated, as on account of getting the full benefit of the warm Japan current, grazing is possible for at least ten months of the year, despite its northern latitude.—Vancouver Sun.

The Prince Rupert was delayed in arriving this morning. She did not get in until after 12 o'clock. The train was held for the through passengers.

Mr. W. P. Lynch and Mr. Geo. Frizzell came back from the south today. They were accompanied by Mr. J. S. Cowper, M. P. P., late editor of The Daily News, and of the staff of the Vancouver Daily Province.

The order of the food controller prohibiting the sale of cereals in small packages has been rescinded. It was proposed that 20 lbs. be the minimum size of package, but this has not been found to be practicable.

At the assize court this morning, sentence, which had been deferred in the case of Johnny May, the Hazelton Indian accused of assault and resisting arrest, was pronounced by Mr. Justice Clement. He got six months in the Okalla Prison farm.

THE POLICE COURT

Notwithstanding the enforcement of the Prohibition Act, there is apparently no lack of supplies of that which was prohibited in some places still. Yesterday one man was fined \$50.50 for an infringement of the act, while at the police court today another man was fined \$10 for being drunk. The other cases which have been going on the past several days were again adjourned this morning.

THE END OF GERMAN AFRICA NOW AT HAND

London, Dec. 4.—The British forces in German East Africa are preparing to make their final drive against the single remaining German force in that colony, which is estimated to number about 2000 rifles.

For this purpose, says today's official statement of the East African operations, which summarizes the November campaign, General Northey's troops are concentrating to the west of the Mochi Valley. They will co-operate in the measures being taken.

WANTS PEACE RIOTS IN PARIS AND LONDON

Amsterdam, Dec. 4.—The Vorwaerts reports numerous peace demonstrations in Berlin on Sunday; especially in the northern part of the city did they assume considerable proportions. In going through the streets the demonstrators called for cheers for peace, and the name of Karl Liebknecht was loudly applauded at one point.

There was a tussle with the police and several arrests made.

The Socialist journal says: "The police authorities ought not to regard such gatherings as dangerous, because the whole people are at one with the demonstrators in their aim of bringing about peace, and because this effort calls forth no serious opposition throughout the country."

The Vorwaerts wishes that such demonstrations would take place in Paris and London, for then "we would not be far from peace."

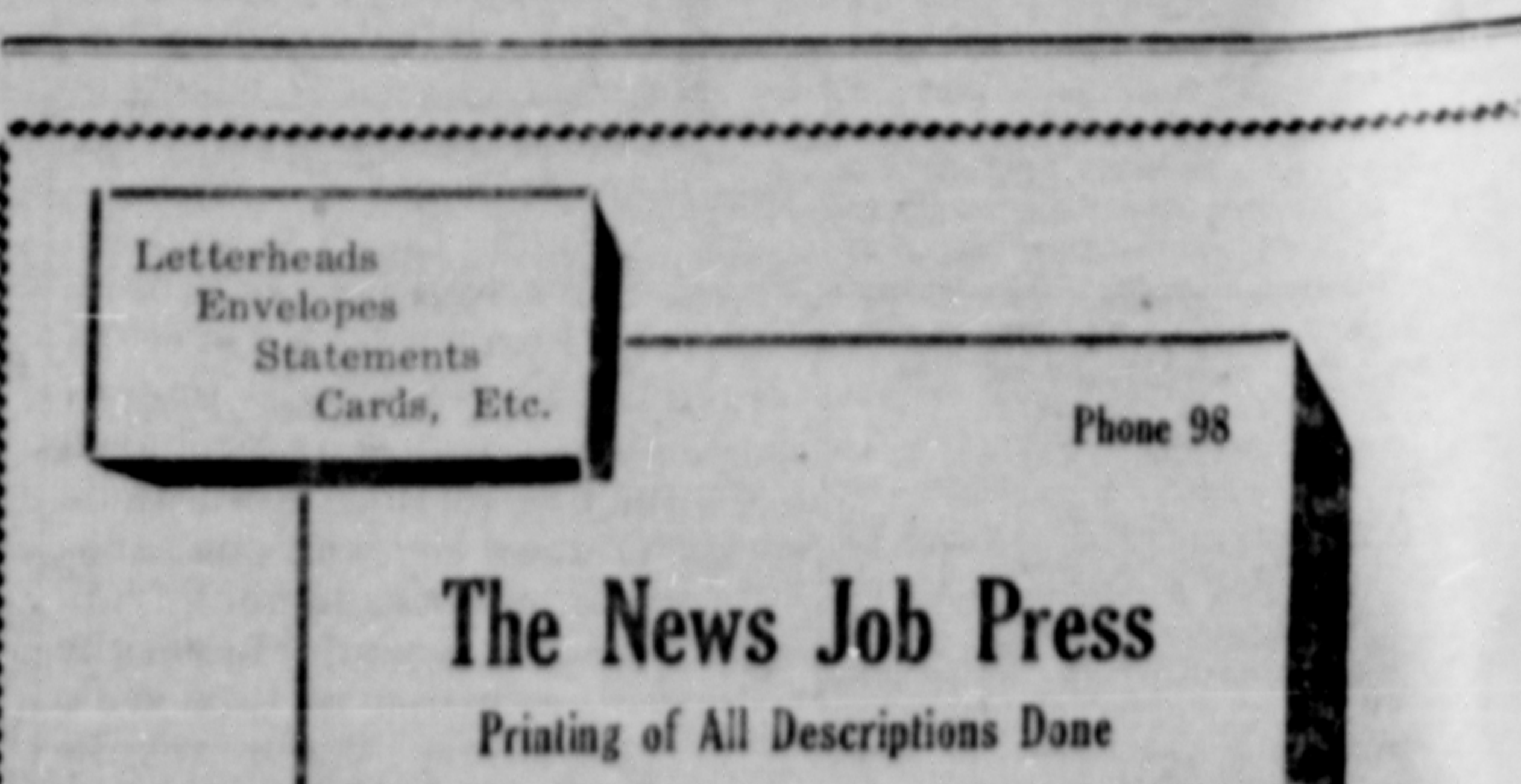
