FIRST PRINCIPLES

One 'of the most eminent hundred years wrote a book entitled "First Principles." That man was Herbert Spencer. In his writing he insisted upon "first things first." That is one of the principles governing our every day action, and which is responsible for success. Failure to have regard to this dictum means failure. And the failure of the Borden Government is the reason why the people of Canada are up in arms against them, from one ocean to the other.

The whole policy of the Borden Government since it took office has been actuated by a wrong motive. Elected as the representatives of the people, it was their duty that such legislation should be dealt with as was for the good of the people as a whole. Instead of this the Borden Government have taken as their first principle to do everything for the benefit of their own party particularly and to retain office, so that the could go on misgoverning the people for their own ends.

Apart from the manner in which they were elected, which was not particularly creditable, the first thing they did when they took office was to fire 12,-000 civil servants and appoint 25,000 of their own partisans to take their places. Since the war began, public affairs have been managed in the interests of the friends of the Borden Government, quite irrespective of the good of the whole people. Milking the public treasury for their friends was the chief pastime of the Borden Government. The graft scandals which came to light are sufficient to show this. War supplies of every kind offered an opening for graft, which was well and truly taken advantage of The buccaneering career of the Borden Government wound up with the C. N. R. steal o! as much as \$10,000,000. Truly, they were no pikers, in their own interests.

But when we regard the interests of Canada, well, that's another story. The Borden government has consistently refused to place Canada upon

a war basis. So far as the interests of Canada are concerned, their piking is shown with the Military Service Act. It is a half measure. It is not conscription. It is only part conscription. The true application of the principle of conscription would take first things first. With the proper conscription of the industries of Canada, the Dominion would be in far better shape to support the boys in the trenches. But this might effect the profits of the war profiteers. Therefore the Borden Government was not permitted to do it. That had to be left for Laurier-if he got into power, which the profiteers and the "interests" are doing all in their power to prevent. Their cry is, appeal to the other fellow's patriotism, and if he's wise to our game, take him anyway. But leave our profits alone. And the Borden Government have lived up to their instructions.

Instead of nationalizing her essential war and other industries, the Borden Government has given free reign to the Victory Loan, they are free from all taxation. Sir Thomas White is a good finance minister-for the profiteer.
