THE REASON WHY

In other of the allied countries, in France and Great Britain and in the United States, the Labor leaders are in close touch with their governments in all that pertains to the many problems that arise out of every day work. The same thing is seen in Australia and South Africa. In these great democracies, the government gets close to the people and in this time of stress, closer than ever before, for the national weal. But in Canada, a supposedly democratic country, do. we find what we might expect in view of what has happened and is happening elsewhere? In Canada organized Labor is the avowed enemy of the government of the day, which is the Borden government Taking into consideration what is the case in these other democracies it must be plain that there is something rotten in the state somewhere, when the working men of a great nation unanimously oppose the government "de jure."

The unanimous feeling of the people who form the backbone of the nation is in opposition to the Borden government and this is no idle whim. It is not; the unconsidered action of al few fanatics, such as are to be found in every camp, no matter of what political color. Instead, it is the well considered and weighed judgment of an educated and skilled body of men. They are unanimous in their condemnation of Sir Robert Borden.

The reason is to be found in his actions, and in the actions. condoned by him, of his Cabinet during the past six years and more especially since the war began. The policy of the Borden government has not been in the interests of the people, as a whole. The stern realities of this fact has been brought home to the wageearners in no uncertain manner. They have been exploited to the utmost, while the Borden government looked on and said to the exploiters, "Go to it." They have been taxed out of all proportion with the moneyed classes. They see Canada surrounded by a tariff wall de-

signed for the purpose of enabling the Canadian manufacturer to soak them a little more and they have seen the Borden government instead of doing anything to assist them, making that wall just a little bit higher, and requiring for its upkeep the expenditure of millions of dollars annually for a host of customs officials. They have seen the grafter and the profiteer stand before the King. They have seen them heap up millions, which the Borden government refuses to tax. They have seen the national shops, where munitions might have been turned out at cost; handed over to the profiteer, so that he may make huge profits that the people have to pay for.
