IN THE LETTER BOX

Dear Editor:—On my way home last Saturday night, I dropped into the Tory committee rooms to hear the much advertised discourse on the fish question. I expected to hear something new, but I was keenly disappointed, for nothing new was said. It was the same old "bunk" that we have been fed on for years. We are tired of this, and we would like to see this question divorced from politics altogether. But apparently this is not to be. This important question must now, like many others, be dragged in as a red herring across the trail of Borden's bungling incapacity, graft and corruption.

Mr. Morrow, the star performer at the aforesaid meeting, is neither a fishman nor a fisherman. His knowledge of the fish business is superficial. Very much so. He may have invested a few dollars in a cannery, but I doubt very much if he could distinguish a dog salmon from a sockeye today. What he knows of the game he acquired through reading stereotyped pamphlets, and through interrogating bona fide fishmen. He reminds me very much of the boastful man who, at the theatre, annoyed Epictetus, the Greek philosopher, by boasting of his own wisdom. To clinch his argument the braggart said: "I am wise for I have conversed with many wise men." Epictetus replied: "I also have conversed with many rich men but I am not rich." Thus it is with Mr. Morrow. He has conversed with many cannerymen and fishermen, and he has acquired a smattering knowledge on the question. We are told that a little knowledge is a dangerous thing, and it may prove so in this case.

Mr. Morrow places all the blame for the fisherman's woes on the shoulders of Laurier, and his late-lamented administration, all of which is mere twaddle not worthy of a moment's thought. We are more concerned with the present conduct of affairs, and we do know something of what has been going on here for the last few years, and we mean to have a change. Our only weapon is the ballot, and it behoves every fisherman and every other man or woman, who has the interests of Prince Rupert at heart, to vote against Borden and his so-called Union Government.

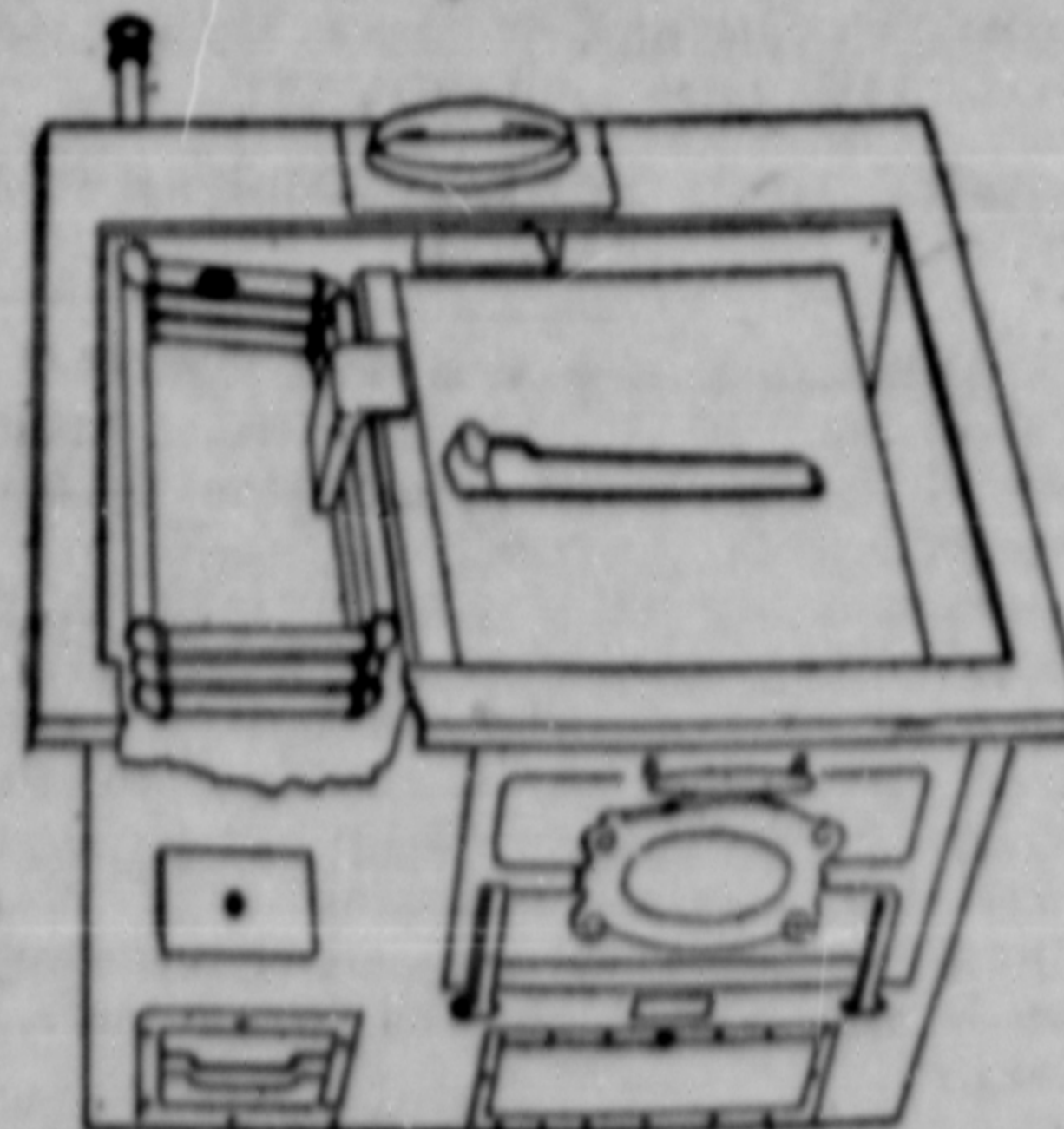
