It was rather late in the day, Mr. Wade said, for Sir Robert to accuse the Nationalists of Quebec with disloyalty after he had taken seven members of that body into his government and given them big billets-seven men who had talked about shooting holes in the flag.

Emphasis was laid on the fact that at the time the government had introduced conscription of flesh and blood it had dropped conscription of wealth owing to the pressure of big interests, and the speaker quoted figures indicating the difference between what had been done in England with what was being done in Canada in this respect.


