TWO MILLION DOLLARS' WORTH OF PLATINUM BROUGHT FROM RUSSIA

A Pacific Port, Dec. 15.—In boxes carried as luggage, F. W. Draper, an American engineer, brought from Petrograd 21,000 ounces of platinum, the safe arrival of which at a Pacific port was announced in Washington yesterday. The metal, valued at nearly \$2,000,000, is consigned to the secretary of commerce, and is urgently needed for war purposes. Draper, in relating the history of his trip, said he travelled alone and unharmed across Siberia to Vladivostok, where he took a steamer.

THE KAISER TALKS OF GERMAN WRATH

Amsterdam, Dec. 15.—A Berlin telegram says the Kaiser has sent the following message to General von Below:—

On the Upper Italian battlefields German troops, side by side with our loyal Austro-Hungarian allies, broke, under your command, through the strongly and tenaciously defended mountain positions of the Italians on the Isanzo, and forced their way out from the Julian Alps. After an incessant pursuit across the Friuli Plain the Piave has been reached, the rearwards of the Italians offering a desperate resistance. The pouring rain and miry roads could not arrest the swift and victorious course of your army.

Our faithless former ally has experienced what German wrath and German strength can accomplish. With me, the Fatherland thanks its incomparable sons. Forward with God!—Wilhelm.

NO MORE SCHAFFNAPPS!

Amsterdam, Dec. 17.—The 200 distilleries of Scheidam, which produce vast quantities of gin and other liquors, have been notified by the Government's grain bureau, The Telegraaf reports, that after this week no more grain will be supplied for conversion into alcoholic products. This means the paralysis of one of the industries for which Holland is best known abroad. Thousands of men will be thrown out of employment.
