REPRESENTATION

As a specimen of Toryism, pure and undefiled by any democratic strain, the recent utterance of Sir Herbert Ames regarding the people of Quebec is worthy of attention. This reactionary stated in his best Prussian style:

"You cannot mix oil and water, and what the future of the province will be it is impossible for any of us to tell at present, but I hope and believe that in time they will do their share in winning the war. Meanwhile it cannot be expected, nor is it desirable, that they should take part in the government of the country."

Yet Sir Herbert is a Unionist. He wants a Union government which seems to make his statement somewhat paradoxical. A statement of this kind would evidence that Sir Herbert and those with him do not want any Union government. They want no government that is not to their liking, or that has any differences of opinion with the bold knight.

It is pointed out that "in his hope that French-speaking Canada will do its share in the winning of the war Sir Herbert Ames will be joined by his English-speaking countrymen in all the provinces. But, it is to be hoped that in stating that, meanwhile, it is not desirable that this element shall have any part in the government of the country, he does not represent faithfully the attitude of Sir Robert Borden. Every effort should be made by the Prime Minister to have this third of the population of the Dominion adequately represented in the Cabinet, not only for the good of Canada's war effort but for the security of Confederation. There is no dearth of material. The French-Canadian units in France include some of the finest types of manhood this country has produced. If Dr. Beland, that splendid, chivalrous figure who will be remembered by Canadians long after Sir Herbert Ames himself has been forgotten, were home would it not be most desirable that he should take part in the

government of the country?

"Canada does not want Quebec to become her Ireland, for that would confront her with a problem in comparison with which the old Irish problem relatively would be of minor dimensions. Ireland has less than one-third of the population of Canada. Laws for the safeguarding of the national interest must be enforced in Quebec as elsewhere, but to help that enforcement it is desirable that the province should be fairly represented in the Government. Incidentally, Sir Herbert Ames is about the last person we should expect to hear from on the undesirability of experimenting with the 'oil and water' of racial interests in this country. It was the political organization in Montreal of which he was one of the heads which provided the funds for that experiment of 1914 and by financing Bourassa's propaganda did more than anything else to create the present unfortunate situation. In these serious times the Union Government should see that its attitude towards grave questions is not announced by the wrong people."
