### SUPPLIES FOR A SUB BASE LAND IN BRAZIL

Buenos Ayres, Dec. 29.—Brazilian papers received here today are filled with accounts of the movements of a German corsair off the Brazilian coast a few weeks ago. The newspapers assert that the mysterious vessel was identified as a German, and that it unloaded an immense cargo of heavy duties at Cerqueira and Armacao.

Several days later the steamer returned to Armacao with additional cargo, which the newspaper accounts say it is believed she received from a large ship out of sight of land. From Armacao the vessel proceeded to Calouro, where another portion of the cargo was unloaded.

These ports are not guarded, and it is asserted that the cargoes landed were smuggled away. Later the German vessel was sighted at San Pedro de Aldera, where two persons now are under arrest as a result of their relations with the crew. They are charged with being spies. The newspapers say the corsair disappeared as mysteriously as she came, and Brazilians believe she brought supplies for a submarine base.

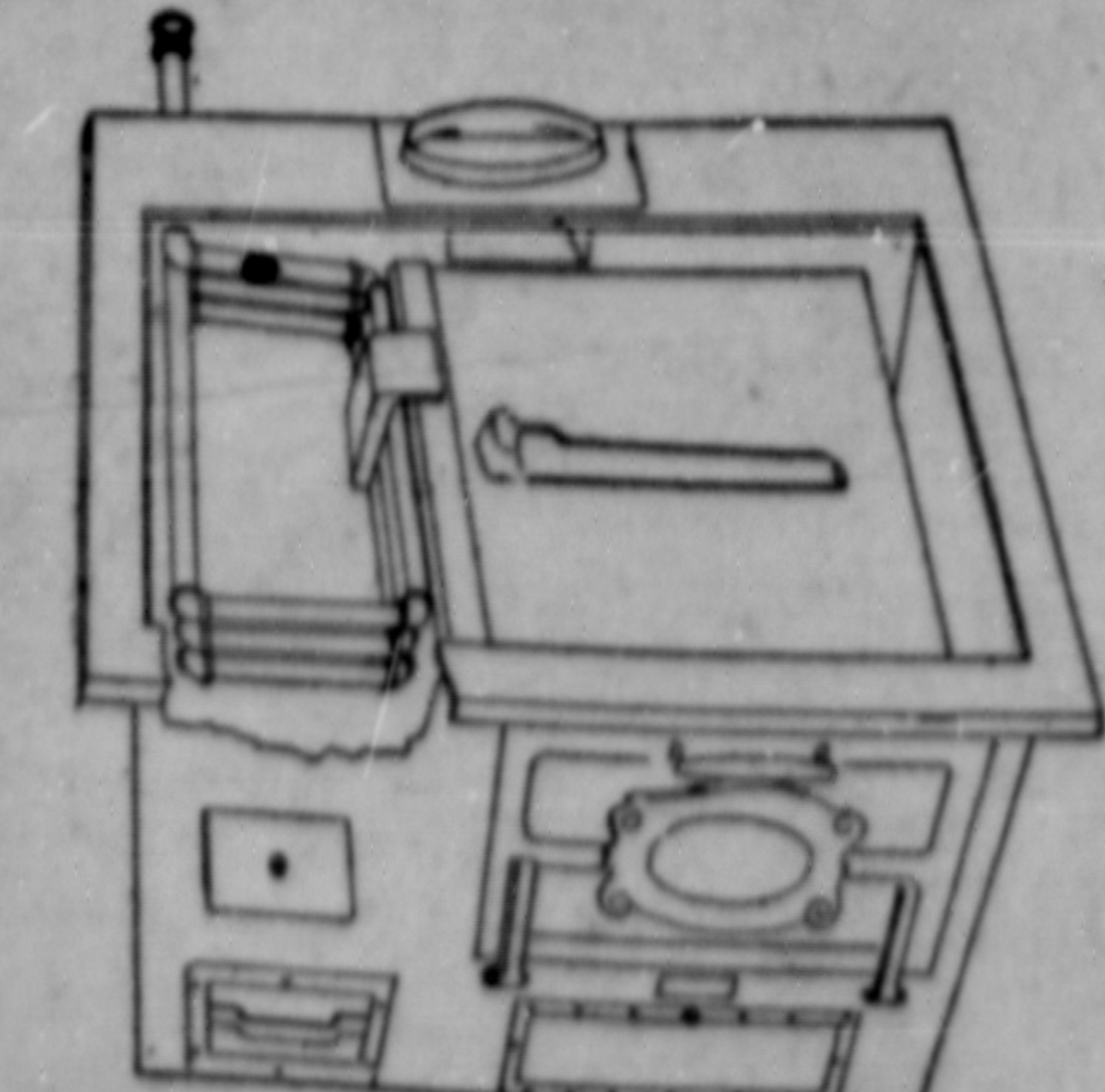
