### THE HUNS' ONE IDEA, "MIGHT IS RIGHT"

Amsterdam, January 14.—"We must recognize only one principle—that might is right, and must know neither sentiment nor consideration of humanity or compassion," said General von Lieb in a speech before the Conservative Congress in which he declared Germany must have Courland, Belgium and northern France. The speech, according to the despatches received here today, was delivered before the Congress meeting at Halle, Prussia. "We will incorporate Courland, bringing in sixty million Russians, and the Slav nightmare will then ride us no longer," General von Lieb asserted. "We must have Belgium and northern France," he continued. "The curse of God is upon the French. Portuguese possessions must disappear. France must pay until bled white. You may call me jingo, chauvinist, or anything you like, but we must have a strong peace."

**ELECTION OF POLICE COMMISSIONERS.**
