

REPRISALS

The recent accounts of the British air raids on German cities, which succeeded each other so rapidly, will be welcomely received by all the allies. At first, this form of attacking the enemy was considered to be "un-British" and was placed on a par with the torpedoing of ships by submarines without warning. Gradually, however, the apparently phlegmatic British mind was brought round to consider a policy of reprisals, similar to that which had been adopted by the French government. This policy meant that for every air raid made on Great Britain, the British aviators would make one back on Germany in return. This was all right, of course, so far as it went.
