> The country was a rich one, and the skill of its people and their learning in these middle ages was notable. In 1654, a treaty was made with the Muscovites to the north, for the unity of the two peoples, but Ukraina was to retain her autonomy, but bit by bit, since that time, it has been filched away. This treaty was an offensive one. The gradual restriction of their liberties made the Ukrainians revolt against the usurpation of all authority by Peter the Great. Their last Hetman at this time was Mazeppa, made famous by Byron's poem. Sweden was to come to the aid of the Ukrainians, but before their assistance arrived, the battle of for beating these pests any Ger-Poltava had been fought and lost, and from thenceforth, this free people became the slaves of the

For these last two hundred and fifty years, the Ukrainians have been in bondage. Their scholars and men of letters have consistently been banished to Siberia, or to the other fortress prisons for which Russia was famous. ## LLOYD GEORGE HEARTENS LABOR As a direct outcome of the revo-DELEGATES

People are Prepared to Die For it-Plain Talk By Premier.

(Special to The Daily News.)

London, January 19 .- Premier Lloyd George addressing the Labor delegates today said that no man standing on the watchtower could deny the urgency of the need for raising more men. The Premier said that no democracy has ever long survived the failure of its adherents to be ready to die for it. He affirmed that both he and President Wilson, without previous consultation, had laid down substantially the same programme in their demands for the termination of the war.

"Our channel ports are not far from the fighting line," continued the Premier, "and unless we are prepared to stand up to the people who are dominating Germany, Great Britain and the British Democracy, French Democracy, and the democracy of Europe will be at the mercy of the most cruel military autocracy the world has

### HUNS MAXIMUM OUTPUT OF SUBMARINES IS REACHED

London, January 17.—Reuter's Agency learns in well-informed quarters with respect to the German submarine warfare that we know with certainty the enemy's minimum losses, and are at the same time aware of his maximum output. It is believed that the latter has been reached, and since the monthly losses of German submarines are by now approaching their monthly outputs it would seem that with the increasing means at the disposal of the allies man programme of operations cannot exceed what has already been in force. While the situation calls for the exercise of the greatest economy of food on our part, it is justifiable to express the belief that the menace has reached its worst stage-taking it as a whole, and not judging by the returns of any one week-as an effective force. There is every reason to believe that the operations of the German submarines should in the near future not only be held but gradually repressed.

## BRITISH STEAMER SUNK

New York, Jan. 19 .- The British steamship City of Boston has been sunk by a German submarine. No details have yet been received.
