We do not wish to criticize the local officials of the Grand Trunk, but it's high time that those officials at headquarters who are responsible for the delay in forwarding their em. ployees' pay cheques were brought to task. This is a situa. tion which affects not only the employees, but the citizens and merchants generally, and demands a remedy. The em. ployees are dissatisfied, especially so when they are supposed to be protected against this inconvenience by B. C. Legisla. tion, which was put into effect in October, 1917, which made it compulsory on all companies operating in B. C. to pay their employees semi-montily. Why is not this law enforced? Possibly the G. T.P. is not the only offender. The proper remedy applied would remove the inefficiency caused by dissatisfaction.
