RAILROADS

The matter of the nationalization of the different railroads operating throughout the Dominion of Canada is again attracting attention in official circles in Ottawa. The matter has been brought up at various times, but it was always considered that it was one of the things that could very well be left over for someone else.

For efficiency it is held in some quarters that one control and the cutting out of competition would not be a good thing for the community at large. Having a monopoly, the people would only have to accept such service as was given them and at such rates and fares as the monopolists cared to give. That would be a good argument were the railroads to be under the control of a corporation who were out after dividends. But with the Dominion of Canada running the railways, and fixing the rates and fares, this argument is largely done away with.

In a new country like Canada there will always be some roads in the more undeveloped sections of the Dominion which will not and cannot be expected to pay as well as those lines in the more thickly populated sections. The particular line may not pay itself, but in the long run, it pays the Dominion, in helping in the opening up of these undeveloped sections.

The whole secret of success in the opening up of any new country is the proper facilities for transportation at a reasonably cheap rate. In order to assist that development, from a Dominion point of view, the plan would be for the better paying lines to come to the assistance of those in the more sparcely settled regions. For *the Dominion Government to take over one railroad because it got into financial difficulties owing chiefly to the nature of the territory through which it operated, and not to take over another railroad, which paid big dividends chiefly through that same reason, would hardly be good business from the point of view of the common people. Which, after all, is the point of view which the Government of

any country ought to take. The railroad situation in this Dominion must be viewed as whole. It cannot be regarded from the point of view of one single company, when there are others operating at the same

There can be no doubt but that eventually, and at no very distant date, either, the rail- W.J.
