

TRANS-ATLANTIC LINES OF STEAMERS COMBINE

Montreal, Feb. 5.—Announcement of a steamship merger that may mean a great deal to the development of British and Canadian after-the-war trade was made today at the Montreal office of the Cunard Line. The Cunard, the Anchor and the Anchor-Donaldson lines were joined under one management on January 1st. They will be operated, so far as their Canadian business is concerned, under the supervision of the Robert Reford Company, instead of through American offices, as heretofore. Joint offices have been established in Winnipeg and Vancouver.
