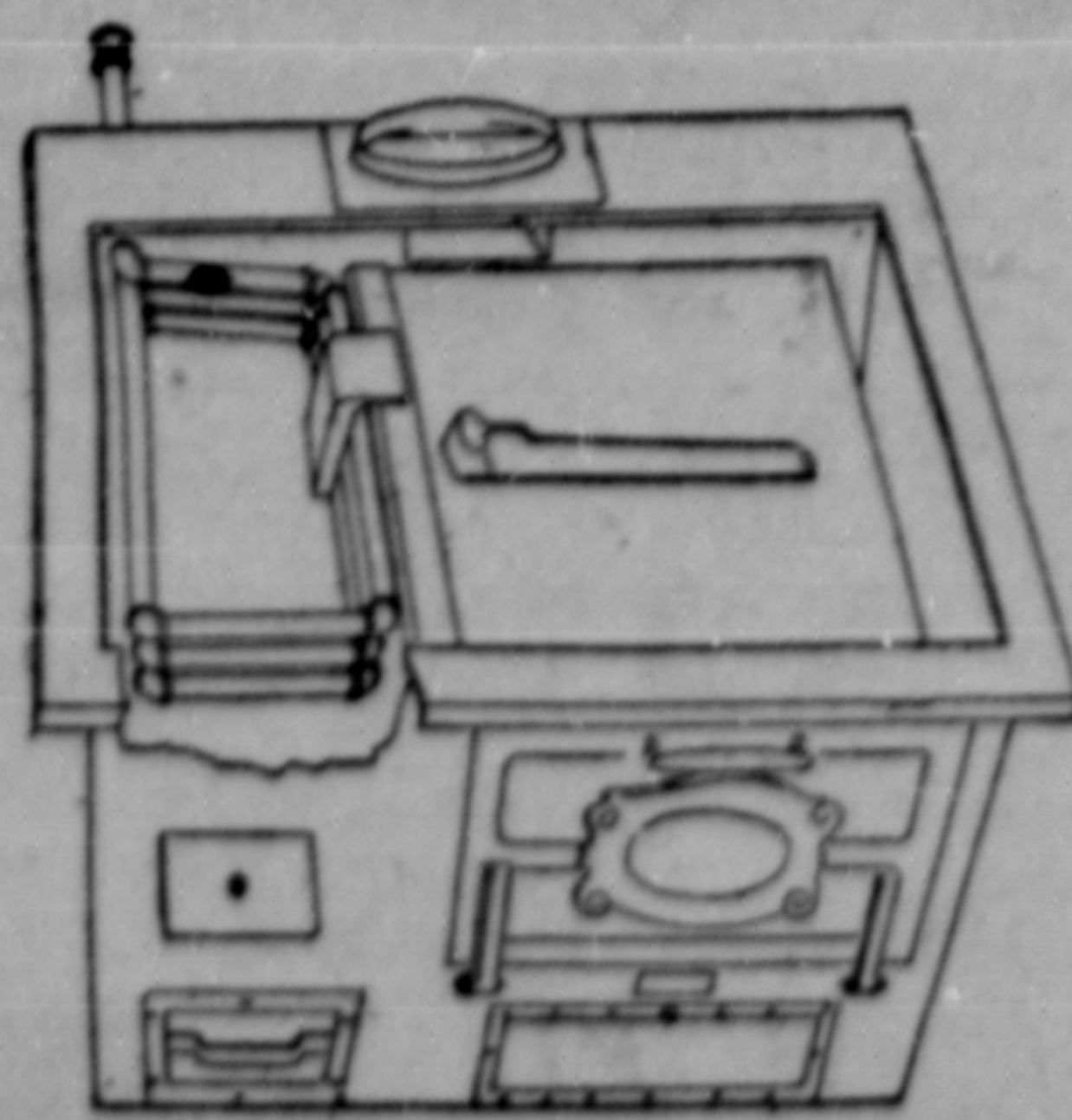

The behavior of Prince Rupert continues to be good. There was no police court held today either.

Mr. H. A. Harris, of New Hazelton, was among the passengers arriving in town last evening from up river.

The Tahoma is the only fishing boat to arrive in port this morning. She brought in 22,000 lbs. halibut and sold for 17 1/2 cents.

Dr. and Mrs. Sinclair, of the Winnipeg Hospital, arrived in town last evening on their way to California for the remainder of the winter.

Mrs. T. F. Duby is expected to arrive on the steamer this afternoon from the south to take up her permanent residence here with Mr. Duby.

Mr. and Mrs. W. G. Norrie, of the Silver Standard mine, who have been visiting the city for the last day or two, returned to Hazelton this afternoon.

The tea given in the home of Mrs. Christensen in aid of the Seal Cove Red Cross realized the sum of \$18. The sugar given by Mrs. Kelsey to raffle was won by Mrs. Blance.

On account of the heavy traffic passing for way ports, the G. T. P. steamer Prince Rupert's arrival will be delayed until 2.30 this afternoon. The train for the east will wait.

The train from the east arrived last evening on time. There was lots of snow sticking to the engine and the bottom of the cars, showing that some of the drifts it came through must have been three or four feet deep.

Word has been received in town of the death of Gordon Lockerby, one of the old timers on this coast. He died on Monday in the Port Simpson hospital. He was an old man of nearly eighty years of age, and his memory goes back to the days when this B. C. coast was practically unknown.
