The Carpenters' Union will meet tomorrow evening at 8 o'clock in the Carpenters' Hall.

Mr. C. P. Riel returned from Alice Arm yesterday and sailed for the Queen Charlotte Islands.

The Prince John sailed for the southern ports of the Queen Charlotte Islands yesterday afternoon.

Mr. Stanley Irwin, late of the Forestry Department at Victoria, who has been transferred here, sailed yesterday for the Queen Charlotte Islands.

The installing of free telephones to the homes of the city policemen was referred to the utilities committee at the Council meeting last evening.

The report from the market clerk was received at the council meeting last evening. It showed that the turnover for January was \$1,897, and commission \$142.

The Indemnity Bylaw legalizing the payment of the mayor and councillors for their services was passed last evening at the council meeting, and the corporate seal affixed to the document.

When the requisition came to be passed in the City Council meeting last evening, one for specially printed stationery for the fire department was not allowed. The fire dept. will have to use the ordinary city letterheads.

Tenders for printing were opened at the council meeting last night. McRae Bros., Ltd., would print tax demand notices for \$49; A. O. Franks, \$58.50; the News Job Press \$52.50, and the Raik Press for \$64.50. The lowest tender was accepted.

The finance committee of the City Council recommended to the Council last evening that the request from the Salvation Army for a grant towards the prosecution of their work be not acceded to. It was felt that this could not be given to one religious body and not to another.

which sold for 25c per can in the stores. The council endorsed the action taken by the mayor in this matter.

Ald. Rochester broached the subject of electric light rates, and asked for information, as he had heard several complaints as to the charges. His worship had also had complaints, particularly with regard to the reimposition of the charge for meter rents, and he had promised to have the whole question reopened. It was pointed out that so much revenue had to be raised, whether by meter rents or an increased charge. However, the whole thing will be gone into again.

Ald. Casey brought up the matter of the loss of revenue occasioned by the doing away with the liquor licences, which amounted to something like \$7,000 per annum. He wanted to know the disposition of the finance committee towards making up this loss. The finance committee did not disclose its disposition upon this question, this being one of the things they have still to get down to.

**CASUALTIES IN**

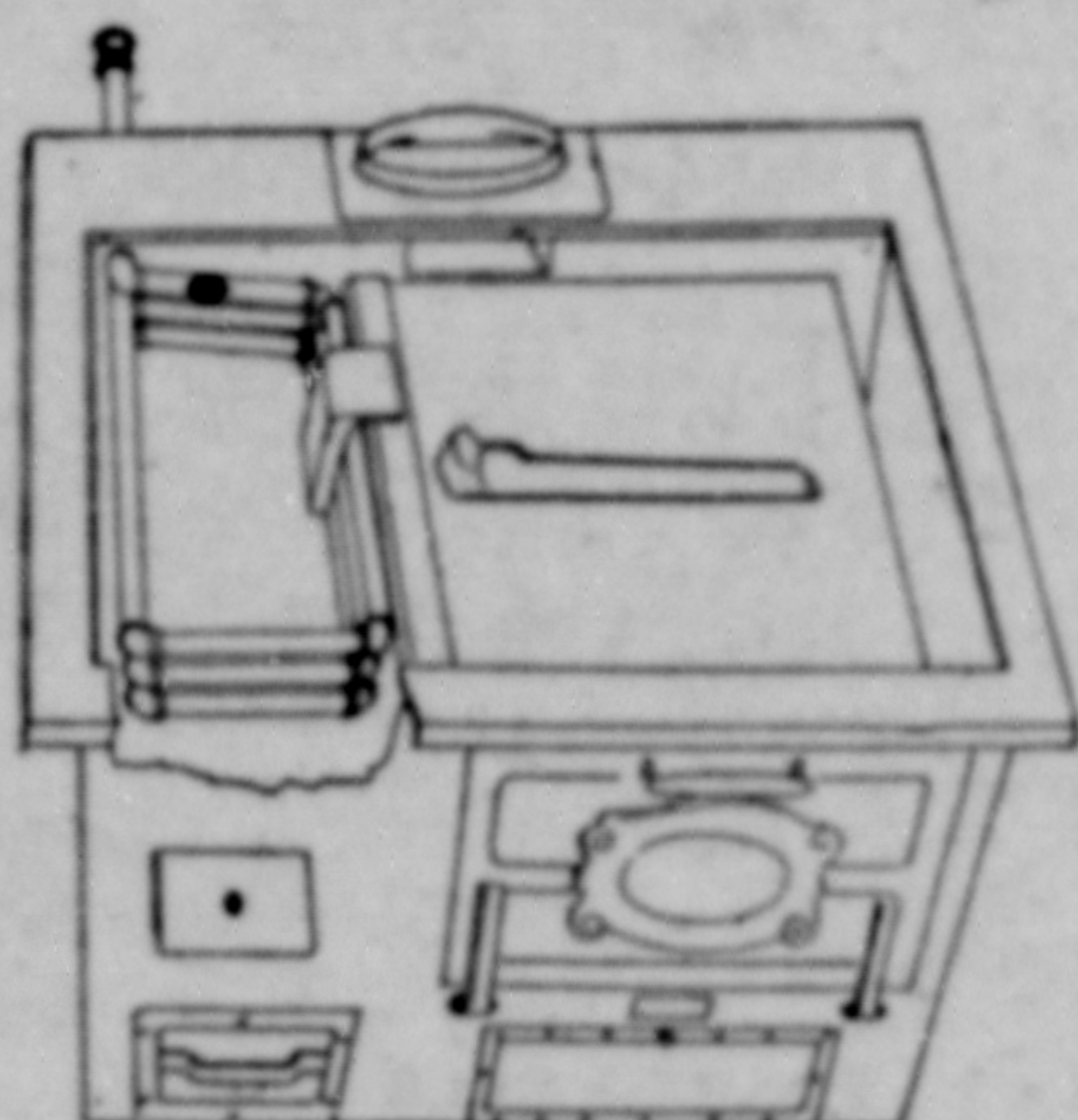
