## HUMBUNG

The origin of this word humbung is unknown, but its meaning is the same today as it has been for many years. The word is used both as a verb and as a noun, and the letter recently received by his worship Mayor McClymont from the Honorable Minister of Marine and Fisheries at Ottawa on the subject of the fishery regulations and the amendments thereto desired by the fishermen of this District No. 2, might be taken as a good example. It is a concrete representation of the abstract principle, or lack of principle, some might call it.

A week ago tonight, Mayor McClymont received the Honorable Minister's letter, a belated response to his telegrams. In it the minister stated that the meeting of the fishermen's unions here were laboring under some misapprehension, but in this the honorable minister is apparently wrong, judging by the information he handed out the very next day to the press. The Honorable Minister considered that until he had received the full report of the special Royal Commission on the subject of fisheries, that it would be on his part "the better part of wisdom" that no action be taken by him with regard to local conditions, until this final report of the Commission was received. Yet within a few days of writing these words, he publishes his decision that no gas boats be permitted to fish with gill nets on the Skeena.

In other words, the people of District No. 2 were humbugged into believing that the present regulations would continue in force until the report of the Royal Commission was in the hands of the minister. It was considered that the Advisory Board would consider this report, but apparently the Hon. Minister does not require advice on the question of fisheries in District No. 2. There is no information of this final report of the Royal Commission being

yet presented. It is known that the Advisory Board has not met, while this latest statement of the Hon. Minister of Marine was made. After conference with the fishery officials—presumably the same ones whom the minister was informed were in the opinion of the meeting here, were "too intimately connected with the salmon canning companies," for which reason their replacement was requested by others "with no local attachments."

The manner in which salmon fishing licences are to be granted favors far too much of the Dark Ages. Each applicant for a licence "will be required in the presence of others, to show why he considers his application should be favored." Notice the phraseology! The fishermen are to be "favored" by granting them a licence, and the onus of proof of their being fishermen lies not with the fishery inspectors, but with the fishermen themselves.

It is time, therefore, that there should be something doing. If the fishermen and the people of this District No. 2 are content with the state of affairs, there would be no need for any objections being raised with the regulations, but the fishermen are not content, and they have put themselves upon record in no uncertain manner. They have already expressed their lack of confidence in the permanent fishery officials, and the Hon. Minister, from the manner in which he has conducted correspondence since his appointment, is hardly in the way to retain it either.

If democracy, which we are wont to boast about, means anything, and if the fact of Canada being a free country is of any virtue, this overriding of public opinion publicly expressed by the people most concerned in the industry, will have to be modified. There's a limit.

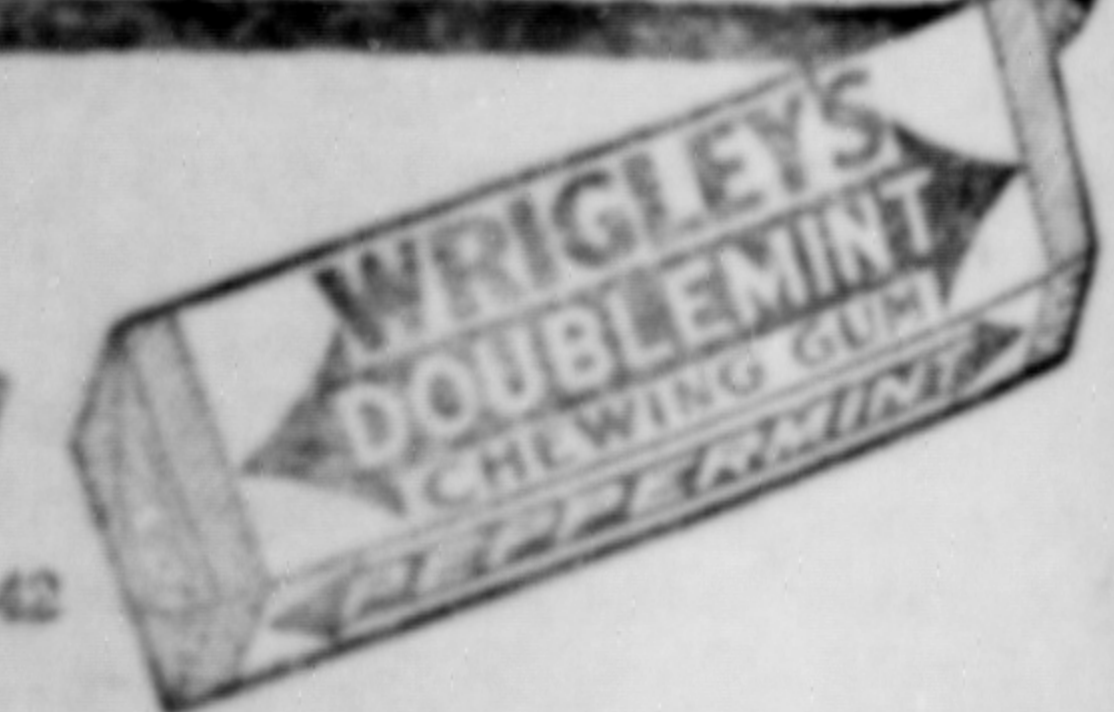
