THE COLLAPSE.

The optimists among us believe that the present year will witness the definite defeat of Germany, and the end of the world war, and that the new year of 1919 will dawn upon a world which has made, or at all events, is engaged in making. peace. There are others, whose eyes are fixed upon the war map and whose minds are obsessed with calculations about the interval which has yet to elapse before our United States allies can send reinforcements sufficient to turn the scale that has been so long in the balance, who cannot resist the feeling that a year is too short a time for the accomplishment of so great a task as the expulsion of the German hordes from the tortured soil of Belgium and France, and that the trial of patience and endurance, which is still before us, is more likely to occupy two years than

In a struggle which far exceeded what everybody believed to be not merely the probable. but even the possible and conceivable limits of the duration of a contest of nations, the pessimists have necessarily been almost continuously in the right, and optimism, even sure and healthy optism, has often had to admit the disappointment of reasonable hopes. Yet it does not follow that the gloomier will always be the truer view, and if the optimist is challenged for expecting too much in the brief compass of a single year, he can, at all events, say that things as wonderful have happened in an equally short space of time.

In the beginning of April 1814, the Emperor Napoleon I. made an unconditional abdication. He would have been a bold man, who in April 1813, would have dared to prophesy that within a year's time the conqueror of Europe could have been brought to such a pass. It is easy now, in the light of what has so long been a part of "every schoolboy's" knowledge to read the handwriting that, in the spring of 1813 was already on the wall, and to speak with confident and pene-

trating prescience about the results that were to follow the splendid failure of the Russian campaign of 1812, the slow-but sure sweep of Wellington's Peninsular army, the revival of the hitherto craven spirit of Prussia, and the determination of the Czar to be revenged upon the faithless French ally, who had fascinated and betrayed him. But in April 1813, these results were far from certain. No man knew that the resurrection of Prussia was a real and determined national movement, or that the new Prussian levies would fight better than the army which had been ignominiously crushed at Jena. No man could be certain about what the idealistic Czar might do, or what new imaginings might deflect his wayward energies from the path of loyalty and victory. None could tell that the long continued hesitation of Austria would finally place the empire ruled by Napoleon's father-in-law in the ranks of his opponents. Above all, no one could be sure that the power and genius of French militarism, which had already triumphed over so many conditions, would not be victorious over this new combination. the loyalty of whose members was not a little dubious.

And at first it seemed as if the pessimists were right. Even after Leipsiz, and when Weilington's army was on French soil the allies were so uncertain about the future that they offered terms by which Napoleon would have continued to rule a French Empire, which was bounded by the Rhine. From the early summer until February 1814, Napoleon continued to be victorious, and it! was not until March that the Allies entered Paris, and Napoleon had only one step left to take, when his army failed


