"The German sword is our best protection. With God's help it will also bring us peace in the west and indeed, the peace which, after much distress and many troubles, the German people need for a happy future."

DROWNS HIS OWN BABY THEN BURNS ITS BODY

Edmonton, March 9.—Accused of drowning his newly born baby in a pail of water and then burning the body in a pile of brush, William H. Erickson, a farmer living south-east of Alliance, 70 miles from Camrose, was committed for trial by Magistrate Primrose, Friday morning, on a charge of murder.

A confession made by the accused was read in court. In the confession Erickson admitted placing the infant's body in the pail of water and afterwards burning it in a brush pile. "Brush, especially when it is dry, makes a very hot fire," was one of the statements in the confession.

ROUMANIA COMPELLED TO ACCEPT HUN PEACE

London, March 12. A provisional German-Rumanian Peace has been completed. Mr. Arthur Balfour, Secretary of War, announced in the House of Commons today.

Mr. Balfour said he had no information regarding any Japanese troops landing in Siberia.

That through error or misrepresentation the publication and possession of these works have been prohibited by the Government of Canada.

That these works have had a large circulation in the United States and Great Britain and are not under the ban in those countries.

That in the interest of religious liberty, free speech, and the best traditions of British citizenship the said ban should be lifted.

Your petitioners therefore pray that the said ban be lifted and the free circulation of the said works be again permitted in Canada.
