SPRUCE.

A bill has been introduced to the Provincial Parliament by the Minister of Lands to ratify the Order-in-Council recently adopted for the logging of spruce for aeroplane construction. During the first reading, the former Premier, Mr. Bowser had some considerable criticism to offer regarding the powers taken by the Minister. Under the new provisions, the government takes the power to take out Spruce logs wherever they are, if the owner of the timber limit will not do so himself. Mr. Bowser considered that the Legislature should go slowly in taking property from anyone. His objection to the bill was that the powers sought by the Minister of Lands are "excessive and extraordinary."

"We agree with Mr. Bowser," says the Victoria Times, "that the powers taken by the Minister are extraordinary. So is the demand for aeroplanes. So are the conditions on the Western front which call for the utmost speed in turning out the 'eyes' of the army which stands between Mr. Bowser and the rest of the Entente world and the Prussian domination. So is the war itself. We are living in extraordinary times and the provincial authorities cannot adopt too many extraordinary measures so vitally affecting the fortunes of the battlefield."

It is a source of pride to every loyal British Columbian that through Mr. Pattullo's prompt action one of the most pressing needs of the allied forces will be largely supplied. The fact that no timber has had to be compulsorily requisitioned by the authorities under the Order-in-Council, nor even the limits potlatched to Mr. Bowser's friends, and that in all cases the procedure has been under amicable agreement, is a sequel which justifies the Minister's course.

Mr. Bowser's admittance of the Legislature to go slowly in taking people's property is nonsensical in these circumstances. People whose spruce is taken under the law will be

compensated for it just as people whose property is expropriated by governments and railroads in normal times are compensated. If the emergency is pressing enough to require the state to take men's lives, for which there can be no compensation, it surely is pressing enough to take the use of the people's property for which there is a pressing military need, and Mr. Bowser, we recall was a strong advocate of conscription. By its action in regard to the logging of spruce the Government has made a contribution of incalculable importance to the Empire's cause in the war and it cannot do too much under that head.

UKRAINIANS CALLED
ON TO OPPOSE ENEMY

London, March 12.—A Reuter dispatch from Petrograd says that owing to the refusal of the delegates of the Central Powers to treat with the representative of the new Ukrainian Rada, on the ground that the Central Powers already had acknowledged the old Rada, the delegates of the new Rada have returned home from Pskov and issued a proclamation to the people asking them to resist the enemy and destroy all munitions and supplies.

CANA KEEPS FOUR
DIVISIONS IN FIELD

Ottawa, March 12.—In regard to the breaking up of the Fifth Canadian Division, it is authoritatively stated here that this action was in no wise contingent on the operation of Military Service Act, it is intimated, had been to maintain four divisions in the field. The four divisions are now at strength and there is every expectation that they will be kept at strength. Maintenance of a fifth division by means of additional drafts, it is understood, has not been under contemplation.
