

MORE FOOD.

In the interests of increased agricultural production, a serious step is being made in this province to overcome the short age of labor by enlisting the boys between the ages of thirteen and nineteen, to help the farmer this summer. The cooperation of the governemnt departments of Education and Agriculture is being sought. whereby the boys of the High Schools might be secured under official authority, subject, of course, to the willingness of the juveniles concerned. The sponsors of this idea are the Y.M.C.A., who have apporached the ministers in order that the whole machinery of the Education Department might be placed at their disposal. The Department of Agriculture is asked to ascertain where there is a shortage of labor, so that it can be supplied from this new source.

It is proposed that the boys should enlist for a period of three or four months every year for agricultural work of some description, when they will be assigned to the various stations as needed and as requested by the farmer. The whole of the province will be divided up into zones, or districts, over which a superintendent would preside, and assume the responsibility for the welfare of the boys, and the general oversight of their labors.

This new army of workers is to be called "The Soldiers of of the Soil," and the plan has been endorsed by Dr. McLean. In time of such scarcity of labor, as exists at this present time, this is but one of the many plans which might have been adopted to get the most out of the ground and in this way helping to "win the war." and to keep the people of the allied countries from going any hungrier, then they may.
