MORE FOOD.

In the interests of increased agricultural production, a serious step is being made in this province to overcome the short age of labor by enlisting the boys between the ages of thirteen and nineteen, to help the farmer this summer.

It is proposed that the boys should enlist for a period of three or four months every year for agricultural work of some description, when they will be assigned to the various stations as needed and as requested by the farmer.

This new army of workers is to be called "The Soldiers of the Soil," and the plan has been endorsed by Dr. McLean.

RECIPROCITY.

The question of Reciprocity is one of the things which Canadians ought to be familiar with. It has been before the country in one particular form for several years past.

With regard to trade, we have seen the government returned to power as opposed to it, with our neighbours to the south under stress of war conditions, compelled to introduce it, much to the relief of certain classes, and to the benefit of the people of this Dominion as a whole.

The Kaiser and his staff, however, are equally impressed with the necessity of reciprocity in Europe, in the matter of air raids. They believe in tit for tat, if at all possible, only the "tit" which the German aviators are capable of does not seem to be so effective as the "tat" which the allied air-men have given to the German side of the border.

The raid made upon German cities were withheld for many months. The British government were loth to sanction this form of frightfulness, even if it were practiced by the Germans.

This terror which flieih by night cannot be said to be the most conducive to sound sleep, and the air raids which the Germans have made on Great Britain and France have had the very opposite effect from what was expected by the High Hun.
