FOOD CONTROL.

At last, the Food Control Board is to be vested with the authority to take steps to prevent waste and hoarding of food that is,—as far as this can be done. The Board now has the power to seize supplies of food held by those dealing in them, where the continued holding of them would result in their deterioration. They further give the Board the power to prescribe the amount of food that may be sold, consumed or used at any one meal or at any one time.

In the case of food hoarding by individuals or by companies which, in the opinion of the Board, is likely to lead to food waste, the Board itself will order the commodities sold outright, and if the order be not obeyed will seize the food and dispose of it, returning the proceeds to the owner, less the cost of the sale. Further, the Board is authorized to define the amount of any kind of food that may be purchased or held by any one person or company, or may seize all amounts purchased or held in excess of the amounts as prescribed. (Penalties of fine or imprisonment, or both, are fixed by the regulations.)

Cabinet approval of these regulations no doubt was forced by the inquiry of the Winnipeg civic authorities regarding the wastage of 8,500 pounds of chicken which had become unfit for human consumption, by the Winnipeg branch of The William Davies Company, Limited, and the disclosure following the revelations of Mr. O'Connor, the Cost of High Living Commissioner, must have convinced the cabinet that the recommendations of the Food Control Board were none too drastic. There always will be a certain amount of food waste and all the regulations ever drafted cannot prevent it, but wastage on such a scale as was discovered in Winnipeg and has been reported upon by Mr. O'Connor from time to time can be prevented by prompt, firm action on the part of the authorities.

The enforcement of the regulations, prosecutions and

the imposition of punishment under them are left to the municipalities which will receive whatever fines are paid as the result of proceedings undertaken by them. This probably is the most effective means by which the regulations can be enforced, for the Food Control Board has not the organization to undertake the duty. In fact only through co-operation between the Provincial and Municipal authorities and the Food Control Board can food hoarding and waste be discovered and adequately dealt with.

The Food Controller has issued for the guidance of Canadian housewives, a rationing list, showing the quantities of the different kinds of food which will be the most suitable to use, in the interests of the country, at this time. Judging from the quantities which the Board prescribes for the average family of five persons, there is little danger of Canadians going hungry. It is safe to state that the majority of the people of Canada are not using the minimum quantities right now prescribed by the Food Board.

AFTER THE WAR.

To those people who are under the impression that after the war is over and the terms of peace are settled, when the now fighting nations turn their spears into pruning hooks, attending once again to the business of getting a living, Germany will again be accepted into the family of nations, and all horrible deeds will be overlooked, wiped out with the signing of the peace treaty, the open letter which Frederic Harrison, the well known British writer, has addressed to his former friend, the German Professor Brentano, may give cause for another thought upon this subject. Mr. Harrison writes in part: "I tell you that for years to come, the German name will spell shame to every true man and woman of British blood. . . . Henceforth in Europe, a German will be taboo—outside the pale of civilized man."

"This war will not end as all

modern wars have ended. It has been the inundation of barbarism upon civilization of a kind unheard since Oriental and medieval incursions. It is the deluge of a whole race, drunk with the lust of blood and booty, "running amok" upon their peaceful neighbours. In this orgy they have outraged every law of morality—defied every decency of civil life,—destroyed the sacred relics of past ages—prostituted science to become the tool of torture—proclaimed terrorism to be the new code of nations. Every utterance of your Kaiser, of your staff, of your press has been false—slandrous treacherous brazen lies to conceal their own disasters, to accuse their enemies of fictitious crimes. And your people, to a man, woman or child, with one voice applaud these treacheries, mendacities, and infamies."

These are not the words of a firebrand or an inconsequential scribbler. Mr. Harrison is in his own words, "an independent student of society, a social worker, wholly detached from politics, party, army, or government" and "in extreme old age." His position is recognized, and his opinion is one that carries some weight.

As long as this generation lives, the name of Germany, or of anything German will at once be associated with the Lusitania, the horrors of Belgium, and of Serbia, and the full story of the war is not yet half told.
