MIGHT IS RIGHT?

A year ago Russia was one of the first powers in the world. Today it is one of the most tragic wrecks in history, and the enemy is salving from the ruins whatever may be of use to him in strengthing his power to hold the Russian people in serfdom and to carry on his campaign for the destruction of liberty throughout the world. Whatever may have been the motives of the Bolsheviki leaders that is the result of their work, and it is with the result that the world has to do. The account against Czarism was no doubt a heavy one, but under the Czar, Russia was at least a country, capable of protecting the lives and property of its people from foreign invaders, and offering an opportunity for the evolution of a system of government democratic in its ideals and based upon principles of justice. The leaders in the original revolution seem to have had in mind the hope that they could hasten this process of evolution by upsetting the established order of things.
