

AGAINST THE WHOLE WORLD

Though all hope of a Russian recovery has practically vanished, Germany certainly seems to be risking something by her present display of cynical arrogance with regard to that country. The world's ultimate safety against strong bullies lies very largely in their fatal tendency to make a premature jettison of conciliatory pretences-to grasp at the prey before it is thoroughly entangled in the net. The contemptuous ignoring of the Russian acceptance of peace conditions was, to say the least of it, bad policy on Germany's part. It has given the Leninist rulers the occasion for issuing proclamations which, though pathetically falsetto in tone, may have the effect of rousing Petrograd to a resistance which the Germans may find more than troublesome. The highly technical nature of modern warfare does not give much scope for an improvising genius; nevertheless, if a Carnot or a Napoleon were to emerge in Petrograd he might at least be able to make Germany reconsider the wisdom of persisting in carrying out against a potentially powerful nation a policy of open brigandage which it is hazardous to attempt even against those "little peoples" whom the Prussian so heartily despises.

Whatever may be Germany's intention in flouting Russiaa susceptibilities by pushing her troops beyond the limits of the "conceded" territories, it is not for us to quarrel with her policy. Every mile she marches towards the Russian capital weakens by so much her power of an effective offensive on the main front, the front which stretches from the Piave to the Yser. She herself is under no delusions as to the scene in which the last and fiercest act of Europe's tragedy must be enacted. Her offensive in the west shows that this is so, but much has happened since Cambrai. The Allies have profited by their mistakes. The establishment of the Versailles Council has been the copingstone of the hard constructive

and unifying work that has been going on in the Allied armies since the autumn. France is stronger and better prepared than at any time since 1914.
