## HOW FARMERS ARE PENALIZED BY THE CUSTOMS DUTIES

Ottawa, April 15.—The farmers  
of Canada contributed \$2,119,267  
to the Federal Treasury during  
the fiscal year 1916-17 in customs  
taxes on agricultural implements  
and farm machinery. Figures  
given to the Commons by the  
Minister of Customs, in reply to  
a question by Mr. J. F. Reid of  
Mackenzie, show that customs  
taxation for the year on thrashing  
machinery, outfits, etc., totalled  
\$477,895; on traction engines,  
portable engines, etc., for farm  
purposes, \$896,356; on harvesters  
and reapers, \$89,257; on ploughs  
and parts thereof, \$373,564, and  
on other farm machinery, \$280,-  
255.

These figures are of signifi-  
cance in view of the debate which  
will take place in the Commons  
soon on the Opposition motion  
for free agricultural implements.

## COMPETITION TO RULE ENTRY TO CIVIL SERVICE

Ottawa, April 15.—Formal  
notice is given by Hon. A. K. Mac-  
lean of the resolution on which  
the new Civil Service Bill will be  
based. The resolution, which sets  
forth the purpose of the Govern-  
ment "to make appointments to  
the public service upon competi-  
tive examination and otherwise  
eliminate political patronage in  
the control and management of  
the service," is as follows:

"That it is expedient to con-  
solidate, revise and amend the  
Civil Service Acts of Canada, and  
to provide that the salary of the  
chairman of the Civil Service  
Commission shall be \$6,000 per  
annum, and to make provision for  
the readjustment of grades and  
salaries in the various classes of  
the inside service, and for the  
inside service, and for the pre-  
paration by the Commission of  
schedules of the positions, duties  
and salaries of the outside ser-  
vice, or of any portion or branch  
thereof, and to make appoint-  
ments to the public service upon  
competitive examination and  
otherwise eliminate political pa-  
tronage in the control and man-  
agement of the said service."

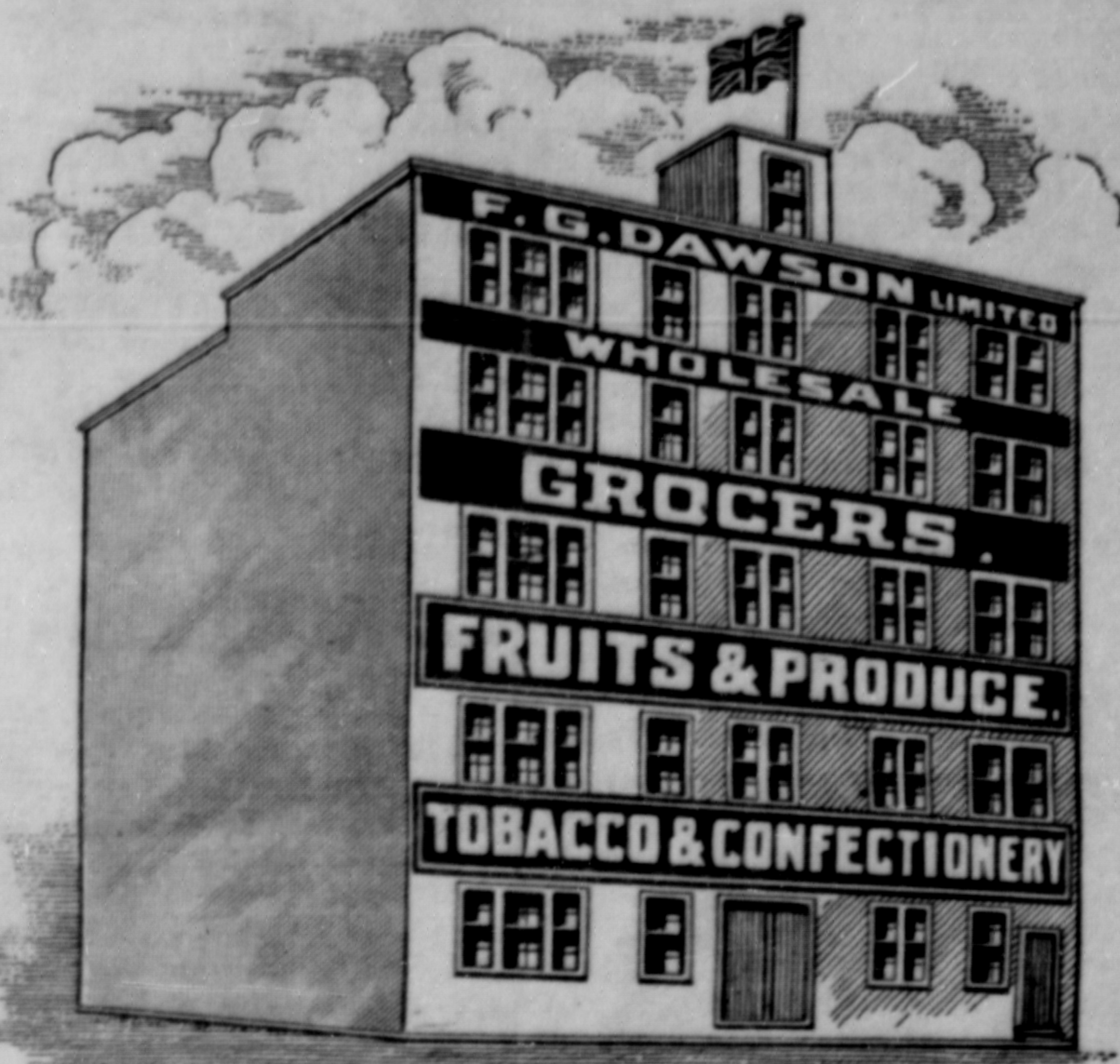
