## Local News Notes

At the meeting of the Council last evening, Mr. George Hardy made application for an increase in salary, which was referred to the Finance Committee.

The City Market did a total turnover last month of \$1,946.58, an increase of \$400 over the previous month, the commission for the month being \$145.98.

Owing to a rearrangement of the service by the Prince John, there will be no sailing to Masset and Port Clements on the 20th nor to the southern part of the Island on the 24th April. 88

The redemption of lots 17 to 22, in block 10, section 2, by Mr. H. S. Wallace was agreed to by the Council last night, upon the payment of the amount of the taxes, plus 8 per cent. interest.

Lieutenant Hubert Ward arrived back in the city early this morning on furlough. Lieutenant Ward left here in February of 1915 with the 48th. He enlisted in the ranks, and has worked his way up. He has been on many parts of the line in France, and expects to be back there again in a few more months.

The vital statistics presented to the Council by the city health officer last evening showed that for the first three months of the year there were 23 births and 11 deaths. During that time, there have been twelve cases of infectious diseases.

Complaints having been received from householders about the unsanitary condition of a surface drain on blocks 7 and 8 in section 5, it was recommended at the Council meeting last evening that a temporary covered drain between Seventh and Ninth Avenues be put in. The matter was referred to the board of health.

"What about the stump puller?" enquired Ald. McRae at last night's council meeting. The matter was not before the meeting, he was informed, as neither his proposal nor the motion to lay it over for a week had found a seconder at the previous meeting of the Council. What about increased production by the City Council, anyway?

A mild objection has been raised to the word which we used yesterday in describing the liquids seized by the police at certain hotels on Saturday night. To some people the word "liquor" only means "hard stuff" and the inference conveyed by this understanding of the word is resented, and rightly so. There is no justification, however, for limiting the meaning of the word liquor to whisky or such stuff. Home made wine is also liquor. So is tea or coffee. For verification of this, consult a standard dictionary.

### PLANNING AHEAD

London, April 15—Germany has agreed to the establishment of a greater Finland, including the Petrograd-Murman railway to the Arctic, according to Swedish press reports forwarded in an Tlxchange Telegraph despatch from Copenhagen. In the event that Germany wins on the western front, the despatch says, she will begin a new war against Russia, co-operating with the Finn.

Japan, it is added, will receive Siberia if she joins in the German-Finnish alliance.

# Grow Your Own Vegetables

**C**ITY people this year must help to grow their own food. Every pound of vegetables that can be produced in home gardens or vacant lots will be a positive addition to the supply of food. Moreover the cultivation of land in city, town and village will leave market gardeners and farmers free to grow wheat and other supplies for export.

It may be that the only contribution which you can make towards relieving the dire food needs of our Allies will be a vegetable garden. If 200,000 families in Canada would cultivate a garden of this kind it would mean a very important aggregate addition to our food supply.

In Montreal vegetables to the value of \$100,000 were grown on vacant lots last year. Calgary had over 1,100 lots under cultivation, covering an area of 200 acres. Splendid results were achieved in other cities.

There is even greater necessity for war gardens this year. Tremendous interest in the movement is reported from all parts of the Dominion. Are you a member of a vacant lot organization? If none exists in your community help to organize one.

Home garden and vacant lot cultivation is really needed and may truly be considered a patriotic service.

## Organized Efforts Will Bring Best Results

Decide here and now to have a war garden. Persuade your neighbours to do the same. All the tools necessary are a spade, rake and hoe. The cost of seeds is a trifle. Grow only standard vegetables such as potatoes, beans, peas, beets, carrots, parsnips, onions and lettuce.

By growing your own vegetables you can not only perform a patriotic duty, you can also help to control the high cost of living.

### GERMANY'S HIGH HAND IS MUCH RESENTED

Montevideo, April 15.—The government of Uruguay has asked Berlin, through Switzerland, if Germany considers that a state of war exists with Uruguay, as stated by a commander of a submarine, who captured a Uruguayan military commission bound for France. If the reply is in the affirmative, Uruguay will declare a state of war. If a negative reply is received, Uruguay will demand that the commissioners be liberated on parole.

The foregoing despatch indicates that a German submarine captured a Uruguayan mission to France. This is the first intimation that such an incident had occurred.
