EMPRESS WINS IN BASEBALL

Sons of Canada Lose 1-0 in Fine Pitchers' Battle—Lambie's First Defeat

In the Dominion Day baseball fixture yesterday afternoon, Empress managed to squeeze out a 1-0 victory over Sons of Canada, which tied those two teams for the league leadership. It was a pitchers' battle all the way between Lambie and Walsh, each man allowing but three safeties during the contest. Incidentally, it was the first game Lambie has lost this season, he having won all five of his team's victories.

The only run of the game was scored in the first inning. Kenny led off for Empress and was tossed out at first by Lambie. D. Stalker singled and went to second as Moran threw out Fong at first. Windle was safe when Johnson tumbled his grounder and Stalker went to third. Windle got himself in a hot-box between first and second and before they could tag him Stalker had crossed the plate with the only run of the afternoon.

Sons tried hard and got two men as far as third on two occasions but Empress managed to hold their slim margin to win the game.
