MANY REFUGEES STILL ARRIVE IN PALESTINE

Jerusalem, April 23.—Armenians deported from Central Turkey to Syria and others who are fleeing from Turkish oppression, continue to arrive in Palestine in great numbers to take refuge in the regions occupied by the British army. In the week after Easter 5,500 refugees reached Jerusalem. A hospital and an orphanage have been opened by the American Committee for Armenian and Syrian Relief and are already taxed to capacity.

A celebration such as the Holy Land has never witnessed before was held on Easter. The various Christian sects gave pledges to the British Governor-General to bury their ancient strifes and observe Easter together at the holy places in Bethlehem and Jerusalem. They met in perfect concord. Four thousand Jews held an open-air meeting on the Mount of Olives Friday and listened to addresses by representatives of the British Zionist Commission.

VANCOUVER GOING AFTER THAT STEEL PLANT

Seattle, April 20.—Vancouver, B. C., says The Times, is going to have a big steel plant, according to Mayor R. H. Gale, who with a delegation of Vancouver business men was in Seattle this morning on their way to Ottawa. According to Mayor Gale, negotiations have passed the preliminary stage. The plant is being financed by British Columbia capital with government assistance.

"We think there is no doubt about the outcome of our negotiations," Mayor Gale said. "We are on our way to Ottawa to take up with the Canadian government the matter of fixing a bounty on production of minerals. The provincial government already has done that, and we are going to ask the government at Ottawa to do the same to encourage the opening of mines and the development of the rich natural resources of British Columbia."

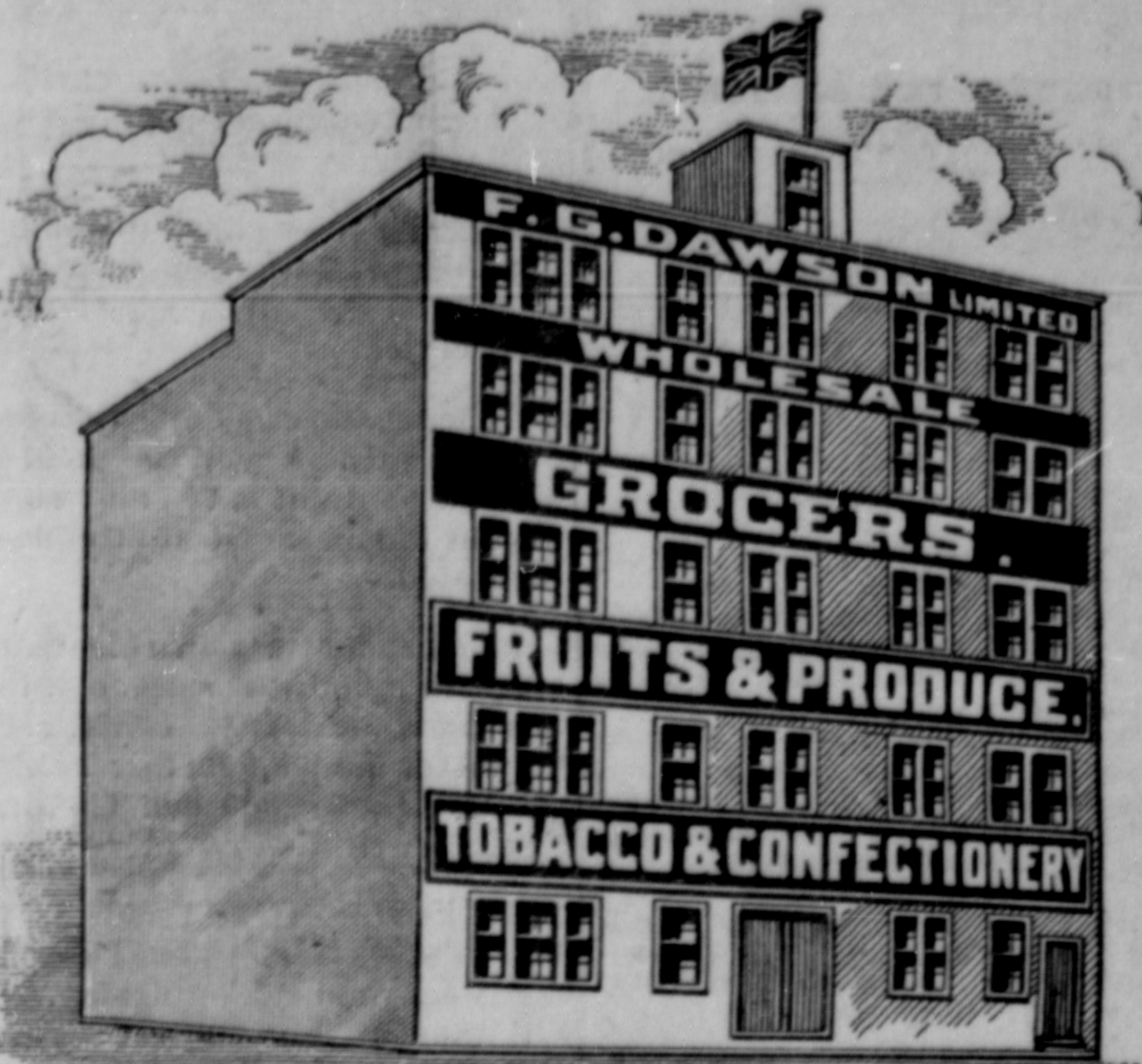
