This is in accordance with a revision of the regulations governing travel between the republic and the Dominion during the period of the war.

> Those born in enemy countries will not be allowed to cross the border under any consideration. except in the case of those who before the war were naturalized citizens of Allied countries. In the case of these latter, they must produce their naturalization papers, which must be endorsed by a British consul. Male travellers between 18 and 45 of possible military age will be asked to obtain non-resident cards from the immigration authorities in order to facilitate their departure.
